

Dear parishioners and guests,

Welcome to the season of Lent! And please let me be the first to remind you that Lent is a time to let our hearts expand with the joy of the Lord! It is not a time for sour-faced suffering and mournful self-

pity. Remember: "For the sake of the joy that lay before him [Jesus] endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2b).

Lent is definitely a time for us to focus on the end, and not just on the means. It does require focus on our part to remain faithful to our Lenten resolutions; if we aren't attentive, our resolutions will likely fall by the wayside. However, if we focus only on our penitential practices without keeping an eye on Easter, our practices might not yield the fruit we hope they will yield.

If our attention during Lent is ultimately directed toward Easter, then this season of increased prayer, self-denial, and almsgiving can be a season of true joy. Why joy? Not because there is any delight in suffering, but because we are moving toward a stronger relationship with the Lord, and our closeness to the Lord is our greatest joy in life!

Think about how much time an athlete must spend doing training and exercise in order to make it to the pros, or how many hours of practice a musician has to put in before he or she is able to start performing as a career. I can't speak for athletes, and I am not a professional musician, but I can say that after I've put in a couple hours of hard practice at the piano (in one sitting), I might be somewhat spent, but I also experience joy because I know I'm growing and advancing toward my goal of being a better musician.

Lent is our training. Lent is our practice. Lent is our exercise. The season may bring with it certain pains (are we really sacrificing if we don't suffer at least a bit?), but if our sights are firmly set on celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus and renewing our baptismal promises at Easter with hearts and minds made new, then there's no reason for Lent to be anything but a joyful season.

I challenge you, then, to be joyful this Lent. Let it be your most joyful Lent ever! May God grant all of us the graces necessary to embrace our penances with loving hearts and to persevere with them to the end. May we be mindful of the real reason we are undergoing this journey: we want our friendship with God to be strengthened and deepened. A blessed Lent to you!

## How long does Lent really last?

Have you noticed that Lent doesn't last exactly 40 days on the calendar? In 2024, Lent begins on Feb. 14 and ends on March 28. Since it is a leap year, February has 29 days, and between Ash

Wednesday and Holy Thursday there are 44 days. Until the end of the fourth century, Lent began on the Sunday after Ash Wednesday (4 days later) and ended, as it does now, on the afternoon of Holy Thursday. It officially lasted 40 days. Some centuries later, it became customary to begin Lent on Ash Wednesday and end it on Holy Saturday. It then lasted 46 days, but the five Sundays of Lent and Palm Sunday were subtracted because they did not fast, and we counted exactly 40 days again. Why does Lent last until the afternoon of Holy Thursday? Pope Paul VI promulgated the General Roman Calendar, popularly known as the liturgical calendar. This translates to "The season of Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusively." Thus, Lent ends on the afternoon of Holy Thursday and lasts around 40 days.
