Dear parishioners and guests,

One thing that can help us to be faithful to our Lenten resolutions is to recognize the potential difficulties we might encounter along the way. By anticipating the challenges that could arise, and by

knowing how to overcome them, we have a better chance of staying true to our spiritual exercises of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I spent the last two columns looking at difficulties in prayer; this week, let's consider fasting.

If "the flesh" (according to St. Paul's use of the term, meaning our fallenness, or that part of us that suffers the effects of Original Sin) is accustomed to getting its way, it will put up quite a fuss when it is denied its desired pleasures. For example: if, in my brokenness, I have developed an attachment to talking about other people's faults, there will be something in me that resists mightily when I try to keep my mouth shut or to say something positive.

Similarly, if we are in the habit of treating ourselves with something sweet at the end of every meal, but we've decided it's unhealthy to continue yielding to every craving, we will likely feel a strong urge to find something sweet — maybe even a stronger urge than before we began to bring that drive under control.

Depending on what kind of fasting we're doing for Lent, we may find ourselves facing the thought: "I can't live without this!" For some, it might be coffee, alcohol, or cigarettes. For others, it might be television, computer games, or social media. If we have chosen our form of Lenten fasting very deliberately, we may find ourselves in a situation akin to being between a mother bear and her cub. Sometimes our appetites can be ferocious!

What should we do when we find ourselves struggling to fast? The first thing is to turn to Jesus. If we could just think for a moment of the terrible torment that Jesus suffered out of love for us, we would surely draw the inspiration needed to endure whatever suffering is ours because of fasting.

It also helps to remind ourselves of the truth that, even though we may feel strong desires for things, there's a lot that we could actually live without. And if we imagine the freedom that could be ours by being less dependent on these things, the desire for that freedom might just push us toward obtaining it. If our Lenten fasting takes us in that direction, we should consider it a very fruitful Lent.

## Presence-The Mystery of the Eucharist


