Dear parishioners and guests,

In my final column before Holy Week and Easter, I'd like to take a look at a couple of the challenges we face when it comes to almsgiving, since I have already said a few things about challenges to prayer and fasting. We are

coming toward the conclusion of Lent, but it's certainly not too late to do some almsgiving. Truly, we should continue giving alms throughout the year!

The first difficulty many people face is the judgment as to whether a particular cause is worthy of support. Whether it's a person begging on the street or an international aid organization, we want to ensure that our resources are well spent. On one hand, I think this is a healthy attitude; careful discernment is part of good stewardship. However, the words of Jesus also come to mind: "When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing" (Matthew 6:3).

Maybe the danger here is over-reliance on our own understanding. If we follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit, we will give alms appropriately. When I am asked for alms, and I find myself resisting, I ask myself why I'm resisting. Is it because I'm attached to money? Have I formed an unfair judgment about what the person might do with what I give them? A lot of times, I end up giving something, not necessarily because I have judged the cause to be worthy, but because I sense the Lord inviting me to be generous without having "strings attached."

A second difficulty in almsgiving is the fear that if we give, we won't have enough for ourselves. True, many are living paycheck to paycheck and counting on every bit of income to get their bills paid. I'm not decreeing that people in that situation should send their rent money to Catholic Relief Services to help feed the hungry.

I do, however, suggest that — whatever our financial situation may be — we make sure God's providence is included in our considerations. I recall Jesus' words of praise for the poor widow who gave, not from her excess, but from what she needed. I also think of the various verses from Scripture that teach us of God's generosity and how He provides for those who trust in Him. I can say that, in my experience, my generosity has never been greater than God's. Each of us must pray and discern about how this dynamic might play out in our life.

If judgment or fear stands in the way of our almsgiving this Lent (or ever), let's ask God to help us to overcome our obstacles and give as He would have us give to those in need.
