The Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday evening) is far and away the high point of the Church's year. Holy Week, which begins today with Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, draws us into the mystery of

the Lord's suffering, death, and resurrection so that we might enjoy its fruits in our lives on earth and for eternity in heaven. This is what we have been preparing for all throughout Lent. I share just a few reflections.

First, please participate. You only deprive yourself of spiritual benefit if you take a minimalistic approach to Holy Week and the Triduum (e.g., "I only have to go on Sundays, so I'm not going to church on Holy Thursday or Good Friday"). These are once-a-year, one-of-a-kind liturgies. Take advantage of the opportunity to let your soul be impacted.

Second, don't shy away from sacrifice. Be mindful of what Jesus did for you, and don't take the easy way out. Yes, the celebrations of the Triduum are long (probably an hour and a half on Thursday and Friday, and three hours at the Easter Vigil), but they are very beautiful. If it's a hardship, you can offer that suffering to God with love, humbly acknowledging its smallness in comparison to the gift Jesus gave for you.

Third, be attentive to the texts that are presented to us in the liturgy this week. Even if you can't make it to church during the week, find the readings (bible.usccb.org) and bring them into your daily prayer time. Take these texts not simply as a narrative to be read and studied, but as the word of God, Who is speaking to you about how He has shown His mercy and love to you in Jesus.

Fourth, consider making the paschal fast. The Church obliges Catholics from 18 to 59 years of age to fast (and everyone 14+ to abstain) on Good Friday, but she also encourages us to extend that fast all the way until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, in order to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Finally, make a good preparation to renew your baptismal promises on Easter, either at the Vigil or at the Easter Sunday Mass. Spend some time reflecting on your baptism and what it means for your life. Find the text of the promises, review and pray with them this week. Resolve to renew these promises in a meaningful way.
