Dear parishioners and guests,

Christ is risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter! What a joyous occasion it is to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. With His triumph over sin and death, we are given the hope of eternal life and the hope of a transformed life even

today, in the here and now. What a gift it is to be incorporated into Christ through baptism, and to renew the promises of our baptism at Easter.

This renewal should really mean something to us. It is no empty ritual, but a profound reminder and expression of who we are in Christ. Our identity as Christians should govern our day-to-day life and be the guiding principle informing the decisions we make. Renewing our baptismal promises is a way of resolving anew to be faithful to the Lord Jesus in all things.

For me, Easter has the effect of putting the difficulties and struggles of life in proper perspective. Sometimes we can get overwhelmed by our troubles; they can fill our field of vision to the point that we can neither see nor think of anything else. The celebration of Easter brings Jesus' encouraging words to mind: "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world" (John 16:33).

A word now to those who are visiting our parishes this Easter and to parishioners who haven't been able to be at Mass consistently: *I am glad you came here to celebrate Easter!* My earnest prayer is that you discover in our parishes at least one compelling reason — in my mind, THE one compelling reason — to become a regular participant in the Sunday liturgy. That reason, of course, is the gift of Jesus' Body and Blood in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. I pray that, through the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion, you may come to experience the profound joy of living a sacramental life.

I hope, too, that you find in our parishes friendly communities of fellow believers who care for you, pray for you, encourage you, and inspire you. Truthfully, the life of the Church limps when her members are absent from the Sunday celebration. Jesus is inviting you! I pray that you find the strength and courage to respond.

This is only the beginning of our celebration of the Resurrection. The Easter season lasts 50 days (note: this is 25% longer than the penitential season of Lent!) and culminates with Pentecost. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24)!








Mystery of Faith
