Dear parishioners and guests,

We had the privilege of being introduced in last Sunday's column to seminarian Andrew Kelley, and I hope that you had the chance also to meet him in person. He will be with us until the end of July, so

please do introduce yourselves and get to know him.

In his column, as you recall, Andrew described his experience of "a spiritual revival and renewed love for God and for our Catholic faith." He stated that a big factor in that experience was his Lenten resolution to attend daily Mass. In this week's column, he adds a little more to his previous comments.

Andrew writes:

"I learned many lessons during that time of conversion, and one, as you can imagine, is the power of Holy Mass. The Mass works on us in ways that are silent and mysterious. Its effect on our soul is like a drop of water falling from the ceiling of a cave; in the moment, it is a seemingly insignificant phenomenon. But with persistence, and the passage of time, those drops will call forth from the ground great columns of stone, and the structure of the cave will be forever changed. To some, it might even appear to be a completely different cave! To worship at Holy Mass not weekly, but daily, is to increase the frequency of those drops of water upon our soul. At the time, it doesn't feel like much. But before you know it, the ground has shifted beneath your feet, and you begin to see God, and yourself, in a new way. If this witness to the power of the Mass is the only thing you remember from my summer with you, then the whole of the last five years of seminary will have been worth it! I have no greater contribution to make. What a gift we have in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Daily Mass times are printed in the bulletin :) And, no, Fr. Kenny didn't tell me to write that!"

I very much appreciate Andrew's comments, and I agree wholeheartedly with what he says about the impact the Mass – especially daily Mass – can have on the soul. In my case, it was when I started, in college, attending weekday Mass at least once or twice a week that things really started to shift in my spiritual life.

I encourage you, if you are not already a weekday Massgoer, to give it some serious consideration. Attend once a week for two or three months. You'll be surprised at the results. That's guaranteed!


