Dear parishioners and guests,

This time last week, I joined my brothers in the seminary at Deer Lake for our annual summer camp for high school boys. The camp, hosted by the diocesan Office of Vocations, aims to

provide a place for these young men to get together for a week of prayer, fellowship, and sport. A central theme of the camp is vocations, and the various talks and group activities at the camp are ordered to helping the men discover what the Lord might be calling them to and to say "Yes!" to it. We had over 50 boys from around the diocese attend! Praise God for calling these men together and for giving them the graces to open their heart to Him and to one another. Please pray for them, that they may hear the voice of the Lord and respond to Him wholeheartedly.

This year, we decided to devote the four days of camp to discussing the four masculine identities that each man is called to inhabit: every man is son, brother, husband, and father, and each man, through his vocation, grows in and reaches maturity through these identities. (The same can be said of women, who reach their own fulness of life as daughter, sister, wife, and mother).

Every man is son by virtue of the fact that he exists! We are sons of our earthly parents, of course, but also, we are received as sons of our Heavenly Father, and there's nothing we can do to prompt God to revoke that privilege. Sonship is the deepest part of a man's identity; it's the only identity that is there from the very beginning, and it lasts until the very end of his life; he is always somebody's son.

Each man is also called to be brother to his fellow men. The presentation on brotherhood was given by our very own Fr. St. Hilaire! He spoke about how being in relationship with brothers is a bit like being "polished" or shined; some polishes have grit or abrasives in them that, when applied and worked into a surface, eliminate the imperfections. Brotherhood can be like this – we challenge each other, hold each other accountable, call each other higher – and this experience, as uncomfortable and "abrasive" as it can be, changes who we are for the better.

Next week I'll elaborate on the other two masculine identities (i.e., husband and father), and I'll also share some reflections on the camp as a whole. Be assured of my prayers for you. Please pray for me.
