Dear parishioners and guests,

Last week, I was sharing about our summer discernment camp for high school boys. It's an opportunity for these young men to come together for some summer fun, and also for

prayer and conversation on the topic of vocations. I shared last week that our theme this year had to do with the four masculine identities – son, brother, husband, and father – and how each vocation, even the priestly and religious vocations to celibacy, comes to full flower in these identities.

Each man is called to be a "husband." For some, this is realized within the sacrament of Marriage. For the priest and religious, this is realized in a special relationship with Christ and the Church. The defining feature of spousal love is sacrifice: a spouse is someone who loves with a willingness to lay their life for their beloved. And this sacrificial love is the calling of every man and woman – not only those called to marriage, but celibates, too. Each of us, married or celibate, is called to lay down our life in love. Each man is called to be a bridegroom to a bride.

Spousal love is also fruitful – when two people love each other, new life is created! This is clear in the instance of married love, but it is also true for the celibate. Think, for instance, of St. John Paul II. Can there be any doubt that his love for the Church was fruitful? His love gave life to people all over the world and made him a father to many, including myself. Each man, whether as a priest, a husband, or a consecrated religious, is called to give life as a father.

Please pray for these boys in our diocese that they may courageously accept their vocation to be men of God as priests, religious, and married men!

Last week, two Third Order Carmelites spoke at our parishes about the Brown Scapular and invited parishioners to be enrolled. After Masses this weekend,

Father will enroll those who are interested. Scapulars are provided for the newly enrolled and those already enrolled who need a replacement. In 1251, Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock and gave him the Brown Scapular, promising that anyone who dies wearing it will be saved from eternal fire. The Church later extended this privilege to all the laity who are invested in the Brown Scapular. True devotion involves veneration, confidence, and love for the Blessed Virgin Mary; wearing the scapular is seen as an expression of these. To receive the spiritual benefit, one must be enrolled by a priest and wear the scapular (continually) with devotion.
