Dear parishioners and guests,

Anyone who prays knows that the experience of prayer is highly variable. There is a wide spectrum of language to describe prayer: ardent, boring, calm, distracted, excruciating, fruitful ... and

one could pass through all of these (and more, all the way up to "Zzzzz") in the course of an hour! People generally prefer prayer that is peaceful, warm, consoling and joyful; but everyone who prays will at some point inevitably experience prayer that is dry and difficult. The reality is, sometimes prayer feels like a chore.

Unfortunately, the more prayer feels like a chore, the more we begin to think of prayer as a chore. And the more we think of prayer as a chore, the less likely we are to have prayer experiences that will change that opinion. Do we not know that our experiences are conditioned by our expectations? If we enter into prayer, fully expecting that God will say nothing to us, that we will be pestered by distracting thoughts, that we will receive no peace or encouragement, and that when we finish praying we will feel no closer to God than when we began, then that is probably just how our prayer will be.

On the other hand, if we pray with the expectation that God will hear and answer us, that distractions will not get the best of us, that we will receive the blessings of peace and encouragement, and that prayer will bring us closer to God, then — even though we cannot demand of God that He do any of this— this is more likely to be our actual experience of prayer, for our disposition is one of open receptivity, ready to receive whatever gifts God wants to bestow on us when we pray.

Praying with this kind of expectation does not mean we make ourselves vulnerable to disappointment. There is never any need to be disappointed in God, for God does not fail us. What I am suggesting is that we ought to have every expectation that God will accomplish good things in us through our prayer, but that we also acknowledge God's freedom to do this in whatever way He chooses. That may include allowing us to have times of dry, difficult prayer.

Our attitude toward prayer has more than a little bearing on how our experience of prayer will be. If we consider prayer to be a chore — merely a task, a burden, a duty to be carried out — then prayer will truly be a chore. But if we always regard prayer as an opportunity to let God's will unfold in our life and to grow (through thick and thin) in our relationship with God, then we will still have the full range of experiences in prayer, but we will be able to see all of them as part of God's plan to sanctify and save us.
