Dear parishioners and guests,

In most cases, quality is preferable to quantity, and when it comes to prayer, this is true. It is much better to pray a single prayer with deep attention and devotion than to pray a whole Rosary or chaplet with mere mechanical

repetition of words. At the same time, quantity is not without value when it comes to prayer: as one matures in one's relationship with God, one naturally desires to increase the amount of time spent praying. As one is working on developing one's life of prayer, however, one would do well to focus on the quality of prayer before worrying too much about the quantity.

There is another factor that is even more fundamental than quantity or quality. I do not say it is more important, but more fundamental — more basic. Without it, there is practically no point in even discussing quantity or quality. This factor is *consistency*.

In my ministry at Bishop White Seminary over the years, I have worked with a number of young men on developing a solid life of prayer. Many of them, being new to the seminary, want to plunge immediately into praying an hour every day. Without snuffing out their enthusiasm, I try to encourage them to start a bit smaller and work toward achieving consistency before lengthening the time spent daily in prayer.

When they try to begin with an hour, what tends to happen is that they do their daily hour of prayer for a little while — maybe several days — and then (finding this very difficult to sustain) they give up on it and fall into discouragement about their prayer life. And then, the last condition is worse than the first (cf. Matthew 12:45).

I usually recommend starting with 10 or 15 minutes. If one can pray for that amount of time *every day* for a month, then at the end of that period one may consider expanding that time by five minutes. And then, after another month of praying for that length, one may make another small increase. And thus, one works up to a daily hour (or more, as one is available) of prayer.

Of course, the main focus while working on developing consistency is quality. Although quantity may increase, that is not the most important part of this journey of developing a prayer life. First, work on consistently spending quality time with the Lord. Then, at His prompting, allow that time to stretch and grow.

# Mystery of Faith (Adult faith formation)

We are watching "The Wild Goose" with Father Dave Pivanka. "Wild Goose" was a term that the ancient Celts had for the Holy Spirit. Our next session is "The Spirit and the Desert." Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. - Luke 4:1

On the day Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit anointed Him. Immediately after this event, the Holy Spirit led Jesus to the desert. The desert was a place of isolation, death, and defeat, but Jesus was led to the desert so that it might be forever changed into a place of grace. The Spirit led Jesus to the desert and also protected and cared for Him while He was there. The desert is a part of every Christian's life, but it does not have to be a place of despair or isolation. The Holy Spirit is present to life's deserts, and when we experience His presence, it changes our spiritual life. The desert is no longer a place to be feared but can be a profound encounter with Jesus.
