

Dear parishioners and guests,

I mentioned in last Sunday's column that, when it comes to prayer, quality is more important than quantity. The trouble is, most people (myself included) probably have some mistaken notions

about what constitutes quality in the context of prayer. That could make it a little difficult to pinpoint what exactly we mean when we say we "spent some quality time with the Lord in prayer."

When people tell me that their prayer has "been good lately," it usually means that they have been feeling consoled. And if they have not been receiving consolation in prayer, they'll say their prayer has not been very good. In my own experience, if I'm walking away from a period of prayer, saying, "Ahhh, that was quality prayer!" it usually means I felt the nearness of the Lord or His love for me, or I received some insight on a particular issue or problem for which I was asking for God's help.

But what if I spent my prayer time hashing it out with God over some recent event in my life? What if I spent an hour crying out to God from the depths of anguish after the death of a loved one? Would this prayer be of poor quality because it lacked peace and consolation?

What if God seemed absolutely silent and distant while I prayed, but I kept praying and didn't waver on my resolution to pursue Him? Is that bad prayer because I didn't feel God's presence?

As we mature in our life of prayer, we realize more and more that the quality of our prayer does not depend on what we feel or what our emotional experience is while we pray. I know a priest who says, "The goal is not *consolation*, but *conversion*!" If all we seek is a feel-good experience, our prayer life will remain somewhat superficial.

What, then, if not feelings, makes for quality prayer time? I think it has a lot to do with our overall disposition or attitude during prayer. Openness and honesty with God are important characteristics of high-quality prayer. Vulnerability is likewise important. I would also mention humility as a characteristic of good prayer. Prayer in which we can be completely present to God is good prayer. The subject matter of our prayer is not as important as our efforts to direct our attention away from ourselves and toward God.

I'll write a little more about this next week.


