Dear parishioners and guests,

Last Sunday, we heard a Gospel passage that is familiar but powerful. Especially for Catholics, the passage's theological and ecclesial implications are profound. Its

personal impact is also great, as we hear Jesus asking each one of us: "But who do you say that I am?" The passage (Matthew 16:13-20) tells us of Simon Peter's confession of faith in Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God," and Jesus' bestowal upon Peter of the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

The appearance of this passage in the Sunday lectionary could not have been timelier for me, as I have recently been struggling with the fact that so many people have left and are leaving the Church that Jesus built on the rock of Peter. In the last three weeks alone, I have become aware of three people who used to be members of the Catholic community in our area but have now gone through a baptism ritual with another local faith-based group.

As a pastor, I ask myself a lot of questions in the face of this reality. What were the main factors that led to their walk away from the Catholic Church? What was it about their new community that they found so much more attractive? What could we have done in the Church to prevent their departure?

At the end of the day I realize, of course, that people make their own decisions, and I have to respect their free will. However, one aspect of my role as a "shepherd of souls" is to help people make good decisions and to avoid harmful ones. And – try as I might – I can't bring myself to conceive of the decision to walk away from the Catholic Church as anything but harmful.

I'm not so naïve as to deny that it can be difficult for the Church's members to remain in her household. For example, I can understand how someone who suffered abuse at the hands of clergy might find it almost impossible to attend Mass, or how the Church's steadfastness in her moral teachings may lead to the departure of people who are increasingly secular in their thinking.

I remain convinced, though, that there are a lot of very good reasons to be Catholic and to stay Catholic — and I'm not just saying that because I'm a priest! In my bulletin columns for the next several weeks, I plan to examine some of the questions surrounding the choice of religion and how we as Catholics can be more firmly grounded in our faith.



She was recently appointed to a papal commission to study women and the diaconate.











Mystery of Faith Series: The Foundations of our Faith

September 5 – St. Peter (episode 2)

Classes start after the 5:30 p.m. Mass on Tuesdays at ICP. We will examine the life of Peter who opens up a window into the teaching and life of Jesus Christ. One of the things that Dr. Gray stresses in this series over and over again is the small little details revealed about Peter's life that make him the chosen disciple of Jesus. Details such as the origin of his name (Greek), the location of his birthplace (Bethsaida), why Peter and Andrew moved to Capernaum (a very large pagan temple was erected by Herod's brother Philip in Bethsaida), and Peter's occupation (a fisherman). All of these things are subtle details that point to God's plan in Peter's life. It would be a really good exercise to look at those details of our lives and see how God has put his plan forth in our lives. Those subtle details: the person we married, our children, the place we now live, our parents and their influence, our work life, our prayer life, decisions that we have made, people that we have chosen as mentors, our circle of friends, etc. Examine those details of our life and we, too, will see how God has called us.
