Dear parishioners and guests,

We reflected briefly in last Sunday's column on the idea that the quality of our prayer time is not measured by the degree of consolation we receive when we pray. Feeling good does not mean

our prayer was particularly good or effective; feeling bad does not mean our prayer was particularly poor or ineffective. I closed the last column with the suggestion that the quality of our prayer depends on the attitude or disposition with which we approach our time of prayer, and whether we spend that time in open and honest vulnerability to God.

I'd like to suggest now that, when it comes to the topic of quality in prayer, we are not the best of judges. This is first of all true because of what I already wrote about our tendency to allow our emotions to color (more like dominate) our judgment about how a prayer time went. Second, we don't always have an accurate reading of how open, honest, and vulnerable we were while we prayed.

Another temptation is to judge our prayer based on its fruitfulness - its *results*. Were my prayers answered? Did I get what I was asking for? Did God respond? And here's where we really have to stand humbly before God, acknowledge that God's ways are infinitely higher than our ways, and admit that we have no idea how effective our prayer is.

So it is with so much in our relationship with God, isn't it? We count our blessings when we can see them (e.g., peace in our family, material security, good health, etc.), but when things don't look so great and we can't figure out why God is allowing situations in our life to be the way they are, all we can do is trust that God is still in charge, and that He is always and only good.

We should strive to allow this same dynamic to characterize the way we look at our prayer life. Instead of making superficial assessments of the quality of our prayer based on our emotions or what we perceive of its fruitfulness, we would do well to approach with as much humility and vulnerability as possible, and in the end to say, "Lord, I'm doing what I can; I trust that You are using my efforts in prayer to bring about something good."

And leave it at that.
