Dear parishioners and guests,

In last Sunday's column, I began to broach a topic that will be crucial in our discussion of reasons to be and stay Catholic. For some, it's a difficult topic. I hope, however, to present it using reasonable arguments and thus avoid some of the

emotional baggage that can accompany this theme. The topic is *authority*.

All our beliefs rest on some kind of authority. We believe some things because people have done scientific research to arrive at their conclusions. For example, we might take a medication prescribed by our doctor, not knowing how exactly the medication works, but trusting that the doctor and the chemists who developed the drug have enough knowledge to make them authorities on the subject.

In some cases, we may trust the authority of others not based on their scientific study but on their life experience. My father did not have a college degree and never did any formal research to become a farmer, but after more than forty years of growing potatoes, I would trust him as an authority to tell me how to do it!

We believe some things because of our own personal experience and not necessarily based on someone else's expertise. Perhaps a friend recommends a particular electrician, so we hire the electrician to do some work. In the end, we're dissatisfied with the work done by the electrician, so our belief about the quality of this electrician's work is no longer based on the friend's word, but on our own personal experience.

There are times when we trust our own reasoning or skill or opinion as an authority sufficient for belief. An example of this would be when we make an assumption about something. Perhaps we've had an argument with someone, and we subsequently assume that the other person is upset with us, without having any solid evidence on which to base that belief.

I offer these examples simply to illustrate that everything we believe rests on some form of authority. Try it! Think of something you believe to be true and ask yourself why you believe it. Even if you answer, "There's no reason; I just do!" you find your own judgment to be a sufficient authority.

Not every authority is a legitimate authority, and in the coming weeks we're going to look at what constitutes legitimate authority on matters of religion.
