Dear parishioners and guests,

In my long series of columns on prayer, I am not sure I ever presented a method of prayer called Ignatian contemplation. Even if I did, a review won't do any harm! Ignatian contemplation is not contemplation in the sense of the mystics, which brings a sublime stillness to the soul as one simply shares a being-together with God. Ignatian contemplation, promoted by St. Ignatius of Loyola, is a way of praying with the scriptures that invites the use of one's imagination.

To prepare, find a comfortable position and try to quiet yourself. Choose a passage of scripture – ideally from one of the Gospels, since those narratives of the doings and sayings of Jesus lend themselves best to this kind of prayer. Read the passage in its entirety.

Next, begin to use your imagination to place yourself in the scene as it is described in the passage. Imagine what you would see in the surrounding area (perhaps the Sea of Galilee, surrounded by hills). Imagine what you might smell (fish, or the sea, etc.). Imagine what sounds you might hear (gulls, or water lapping on the shore, etc.). If the sense of taste can be included, imagine that as well (bread or fish, etc.). Finally, imagine how the sense of touch is engaged (shore sand between your toes, the Lord's touch, etc.). Use your imagination to get a sense of what it would be like to have been there.

Then, let the scene unfold. You can place yourself in any role in the story (as Jesus himself, as another person involved in the action, or as a bystander). Let the dialog unfold as it does in the text, but also allow yourself the freedom to imagine other things that might have been said. Especially if you are imagining Jesus speaking directly to you, pay close attention to what he wants to tell you.

It's especially important in Ignatian contemplation to be attentive to what's going on in your heart as the narrative plays out. Take note of the thoughts, feelings, and desires that arise as you are experiencing this encounter with the Lord. Speak with Jesus about them.

Be sure, also, to pay attention to the way Jesus is in this encounter. Do you have a sense of what's going on in his heart as the prayer progresses? What are his thoughts, feelings, and desires? Let him tell you about them.

Ignatian contemplation can help the scriptures come alive for us. It might also be a good method for those who particularly struggle with distraction!

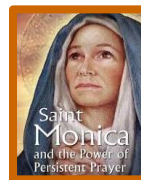


