Dear parishioners and guests,

For the past few weeks, we've taken a critical look at the idea that the Bible is the only authoritative source of teaching on Christian faith and life. A parishioner approached me after Mass last Sunday with a comment that made me realize

that there was a further clarification I needed to offer.

His point (if I understood him correctly) was that, when I argued that human beings could not trust themselves as authoritative interpreters of Scripture, I also ruled out the Church as an authoritative interpreter of Scripture because the Church is also human. I'm grateful for the parishioner's comment because it's a reasonable objection very worthy of addressing. Also, there may have been other readers of this column who thought the same thing, so it will be good to explain a bit more.

The first part of my clarification is that, when I say that the Catholic Church alone has the ability to interpret Scripture with authority, I don't mean that every Catholic can trust in his or her own personal interpretation as authoritative just because he or she is Catholic. (I don't think this was the parishioner's point, but it may be good to include.)

The second part of the clarification is that, while the Church is indeed human (and often *painfully* human!), she is not *only* human. The Church is not just the sum total of human beings that have ever belonged to her. The Church, being joined to Christ as *His Body*, is endowed with divine life. Jesus Himself established the Church not only as His bride, but also as a vehicle for the transmission of His teachings to all future generations.

In order to ensure the accurate transmission of those teachings, the Lord endowed the Church with the authority to teach on His behalf. This authority to teach the authentic faith of Jesus Christ is what we refer to as the magisterium. It doesn't mean that every Catholic is infallible in his or her understanding of Christian doctrine. It means that when the Catholic Church offers us official instruction having to do with faith and morals, we can trust that it is without error.

While the Holy Spirit can and does act in all kinds of people, teaching them truth and giving them wisdom, Jesus still deemed it necessary to establish the Church as the guarantor that His teachings would be handed down faithfully from generation to generation. So, it's not based on her humanity that the Church claims to teach the truth; it's grounded in Jesus' historical establishment of the Church and His gift to her of divine authority.

On Sunday, December 3rd, the First Sunday of Advent, we enter a new Liturgical Year. The lectionary turns from Cycle A to Cycle B. There are three Lectionary Cycles A, B and C. In Year A the Gospel readings are

generally from Matthew; Year B is mostly Mark; and Year C is mostly Luke. Why do we have three lectionary cycles? These cycles are a result of the Second Vatican Council, which ordered a change in the Sunday readings at Mass so that Catholics would become more familiar with the text of the Bible. How much of the Bible is covered as a result of that change? 13.5 percent of the Old Testament (not counting the Psalms) and 54.9 percent of the non-Gospel New Testament.



Silent Day of Prayer on Our Lady of Loreto: The Astounding Miracle of the Holy House of Loreto will be presented by Sr. Mary Eucharista at Immaculate Heart Retreat Center in Spokane on Tuesday, December 5, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Holy House of Nazareth is miraculously not in Nazareth! (Only the basement grotto where the Annunciation took

place is preserved for veneration in the Basilica of the Annunciation.) The Holy House, which was carried miraculously five times, is now in a magnificent basilica, the third largest shrine to the Blessed Mother in Europe. Come enjoy the documented historic happenings that amaze pilgrims who venerate this holy relic and pray with the Blessed Mother for the world. The silent day of prayer includes Mass, Confession, Adoration, two conferences, and lunch. \$45 per person (\$55 with private room).
