Dear parishioners and guests,

Last week, we began to look at how the Scriptures provide us not only with material for meditation and contemplation but also with words we can use to express ourselves to God in

prayer. We saw a few examples from the Psalms. If those examples didn't resonate with you, read through the Psalms and find the words that you can make your own!

It's not only in the Psalms, however, that we can find Godgiven words to express the sentiments of our hearts in prayer. Look to Genesis, for example. Remember how Adam replied when the Lord God called, "Where are you?" Adam said, "I was afraid ... so I hid." Are those words we could say to God at times? "Lord, I was so ashamed of what I did, I didn't even want to talk to you about it. I tried to hide from you."

Or when the brothers of Joseph flung themselves to the ground and cried, "We are your slaves!" Joseph responded, "Even though you meant harm to me, God meant it for good..." It seems to me that these are words we could bring into prayer and express with our own voice.

Of course, there are many examples from the Gospels, too, that we can adopt as our own. Think of the lepers shouting, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" or blind Bartimaeus saying, "Master, I want to see." Those are words we can certainly say to Jesus from our hearts.

Remember the person in the crowd who called out to Jesus, "I will follow you wherever you go." Peter famously said, "Even though I should have to die with you, I will not deny you." These passages, and many more, provide marvelous words for us to use in our own prayers to God.

Many of the words of the Lord Jesus, too, are well-suited for us to say to the Father. How about, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do?" in a moment of frustration with the faults of another person? Or "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." Even something as simple as "I thirst" can bring us into a beautiful place in our prayer.

In sum, when we pray with the Scriptures, we do well to ponder them deeply and reflect on what we are reading. We also do well to pay attention to passages that resonate with our own interior state, and to realize that, in those places, God is giving us words with which we can lift up our hearts to him.
