

Dear parishioners and guests,

This long series in my Sunday column began with the question: what are the factors in a person's decision to join, leave, or stay in the Catholic Church? We just spent a good bit of time looking at the question of

authority, and whether Scripture is the only source of authoritative teaching when it comes to the Christian life.

Today I'd like to look at another reason people leave the Church (besides the rejection of the Church's authority to teach in the name of Jesus), that is, the behavior of people in the Church. It could be the scandalous or irresponsible behavior of a Church leader. It could be an unkind word spoken by a fellow parishioner. It could be the community's failure to reach out when the person needed someone. There could be any number of behaviors that might lead a person away from the Church.

The truth is, we all have expectations of people. We have expectations of store clerks. Teachers have expectations of their students. Employers have expectations of their workers. We have expectations of our politicians, athletes, movie stars, and fellow churchgoers.

The question is: how do we deal with our disappointment when people don't live up to our expectations? If we live in reality, we have to admit that, at some point, someone will let us down, since no one is perfect. Certainly, there is a place for accountability; I'm not suggesting that there shouldn't be consequences for misbehavior. Nor do I appeal to the "it's-no-worse-in-the-Catholic-Church-thananywhere-else" argument. "It happens everywhere" does not make it okay. My aim is not to brush away bad behavior as if it's trivial because it's common.

What gives me hope is that the Catholic Church has a very thorough understanding of the human person and is realistic about the struggle between virtue and vice in our lives. While she is uncompromising in urging us to the heights of holiness, she also recognizes our brokenness and our need for God's mercy. She is also clear in distinguishing between the Church per se and the actions of her members. The actions of Catholics do not always faithfully represent the Church's identity or mission.

When faced with the poor behavior of others, the solution is not necessarily to walk away. Perhaps there is an opportunity to exercise mercy and to learn to accept our brothers and sisters as they are. It may be an opportunity to reflect on our own brokenness as well. As the joke goes, "if you find the perfect church, join it ... and it won't be perfect anymore!"
