Dear parishioners and guests,

Already a week into the season of Advent, it seems like an appropriate time to mention that *asking* is an important dimension of a healthy prayer life. This

may seem obvious, as we often ask God for the things we need or desire. However, what I have in mind here is more of an *invitation*. Advent focuses on the coming of Christ. I am suggesting that, when we pray, we ought to *invite* Jesus to come.

If you expect guests to come to your party, you have to *invite* them. If you expect the letter carrier to pick up your outgoing mail, you have to put up the flag, which is a way of *inviting* him or her to visit your mailbox. If you want your dogs or cats to come to you (this is true for a lot of dogs and cats, anyway – maybe not all!), you have to call to them and bid them come.

It used to be (maybe it still is – I don't go out to breakfast much) that if you went to a diner or other breakfast place, each place setting would include an upside-down coffee cup. Then, you would turn the cup right-side-up as an indication to the server that you'd like coffee with your meal; if you didn't turn the cup over, no coffee would be poured for you.

There is a similar dynamic at work in the spiritual life, and perhaps during Advent in a special way. So many of the prayers we pray and the hymns we sing during this season include the cry, "Come, Lord Jesus!" It's not that we're bossing Jesus around. Although it is an imperative exclamation, what we are really doing is pleading with the Lord to come to us. We are *inviting* him into our hearts.

Advent is when we "turn up our coffee cup," so to speak. We are to express to Jesus our readiness and eagerness to receive him. We ardently want him to come to us, and we call out to him, begging him to draw near.

What we receive from the Lord has much to do with our spiritual disposition. There are really only two possible dispositions we can have before him: closed or open. When we are closed, we have a hard time encountering him at his coming. When we are open, he fills us with the joy of his presence.

This Advent, let's work on opening up! One of the best ways we can do that is to issue the heartfelt invitation to Jesus each day: "Come, Lord! I open my heart to you!" How he rejoices to receive our invitation and to see us making ready for his arrival.




