Dear parishioners and guests,

Last time, we acknowledged that people sometimes leave the Church on account of the actions or inactions of people in the Church. While this is understandable on a human level, we also want to keep in mind

that the members of an organization do not always represent faithfully what the organization stands for. This is true of the Church. Catholics are (as we have all seen, even in the mirror!) capable of actions that do not exemplify the teachings of Jesus. That doesn't mean that the Church herself advocates those actions.

So, while I don't think the Church should be abandoned because of the behavior of her members (the phrase "throwing the baby out with the bathwater" comes to mind), this should be a reminder to all of us in the Church that the way we live our faith has an impact on the way others perceive the Church. We must be vigilant, then, about giving a good example! None of us wants to be the reason – or even part of the reason – that a fellow Catholic leaves the Church.

Of course, not everyone who leaves the Church does so because they got their feelings hurt, were scandalized by the behavior of other Catholics, or wanted to disassociate themselves with a company of sinners. You'll recall that we've been looking at a variety of reasons people leave the Catholic Church, and it's time to introduce the next, namely, that they cannot accept one or more of the teachings of the Church.

It's no secret that many of the Catholic Church's teachings are difficult. Take, as a primary example, the doctrine of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Even in the first century, we have a record of disciples parting company with Jesus because of this teaching.

Similarly, beliefs held by the Church have been contested throughout the ages. When the Church declared that Jesus Christ was fully God and fully human, there were people who parted ways. When the Church maintained that iconography was not idolatry, there were people who left. When the Church insisted that the pope had universal jurisdiction, some could not accept it. When the Church upheld her teaching on indulgences, some went away.

Today, the Church is still rejected for many of these. She is also refused by many people for the way she applies her perennial teaching to modern issues that arise. We will look at some of these next time as we continue to explore factors that cause some people to struggle to stay Catholic.


