Dear Plotters,

I am writing this, on what has to be the hottest day of the year. It is certainly too hot to be outside.

For most of us, this is probably the best time of the year, harvesting soft fruits, cucumbers, tomatoes, salad crops and not forgetting onions and garlic. It is the time of year when we feel excited to be eating our produce that we have lovingly cared for over the past few months, or disappointed that once again, our wildlife friends have had the best of the crop.

I have had a good strawberry crop this year, but the squirrels have still managed to find a way in through the netting. The evidence is the hole they leave behind in the netting, about the size of their head and the edge of the hole is a nice bright red colour!

On a recent visit to the allotments, it was interesting to walk around and see the different methods each of the tenants use to create their own individual peaceful haven.

Some tenants, particularly those who are new to the allotments, spend money on building fruit cages, raised beds, bark chippings for paths, mud stations etc, whilst others, more traditional gardeners, use minimal protection and concentrate on companion planting to deter pests etc, are happy to create grass paths or even no paths at all, just throw a scaffolding board down to walk on when planting. It's also interesting to see how some plot holders make full use of the space they have, particularly those who have a small plot.
