

The Messiah is coming.


Not announced by prophets, priests, and kings. But by two women

INFORMATION ABOUT THE NATIVITIES FEATURED THIS SUNDAY:

All nativity sets depict the same beautiful story of the birth of Jesus, yet each nativity has its own beautiful personal story to tell as well. Manufactured in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, during the depression era, this wonderful nativity crib set was discovered at a yard sale. The original owner purchased it for \$1 before 1940 at her local Kresges Store and from the diary she kept written in the box it was one of her favorites, displaying it every Christmas for over 60 years. We may not know her by name but after reading the account of some of her yearly thoughts and feelings she had as she packed her treasured nativity away for another year she becomes a close friend. She filled both the top and bottom of the box it came in as well as 3 sheets of paper on both sides with family loves and losses. It is truly a gift from God that this scene, so dearly loved and treasured by the original owner, found its way here to First Presbyterian Church where it can continue to be loved and shared. We like to think she is looking down with a smile knowing it has found a new home. This nativity was graciously gifted to the PW Permanent Nativity Collection.

Handcrafted by a local folk artist in Bat Cave, NC. This nativity is created from old industrial spools as the base. The artist creates the clothing from recycled and natural materials. The hair and beards are made from real lamb wool. The creative use of natural materials adds to the uniqueness of this nativity, shared today by FPC member Donna Lee Sheetz.


