



INFORMATION ABOUT THE NATIVITIES FEATURED THIS SUNDAY:

Local Beaufort artist Chris Nietert began making oyster shell crèches after seeing an old manger scene with shells propped up to replace missing figures while at an oyster roast. The organic shapes and markings of the shells seemed to convey a sense of awe, reverence and curiosity for the nativity. The shells on this crèche, titled "Buried Treasure", were pulled from an old pluff mud bed that was exposed by erosion on Hunting Island. These shells had been beneath the sand where the cabins once stood for decades after the creation of the park in 1935. These shells were beautifully preserved underground and embellished by the mud dwellers. Each shell Chris finds "speaks" to her as to what part it will play in her creations. We are so grateful for all the beautiful pieces Chris has shared with us year after year.

Willow Tree® Artist Susan Lordi is known for figurative sculptures that speak in quiet ways to heal, comfort, protect and inspire. She hand-carves the original of each figure from her studio in Kansas City Missouri. Her artistic process is rather intuitive, she "sketches" in clay as she forms and carves each piece. Pieces are cast from her original carvings, and individually painted by hand. Expression is revealed through gestures only.....a tilt of the head, a turn of the body, placement of hands. Notice the "Blessings Angel". Susan Lordi's vision and detailed work are expressed beautifully in this wonderful nativity shared with us today by long time FPC member Andrea Coulter.

Switon, has been involved at FPC doing video recording of services, serving on


Property Committee, Second Helping, mission trips to West Virginia, and Mobile Meals-going for over 38 yrs.
