It is right, Loving God, that we lift up to you all thanks and praise for the self-giving love that you lavish upon us. Tonight, we remember, with reverence, the unshakeable love your Son had for his followers; how he lovingly washed their feet, demonstrating the kind of love that we are called to show one another. Love is your supreme act of creation, a force that is unstoppable even in the face of betrayal and death. Together, we declare your praise saying:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord
God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the one who comes
in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest.

On this night before he died for us Jesus gathered his friends for a meal. He gave thanks and broke bread and told us his body would be destroyed. He poured out the cups of salvation that is his blood shed for each of us. We remember our Lord and his charge to remember each other.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:

Dying you destroyed our death, Rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come and save us.

Gracious God, you call us to love one another, just as you have loved us. May this meal be a source of inspiration and courage that we might follow your example and lavish love upon one another, not just in the moments when it is easy, but especially during the times when it is hard. Send your Spirit to preside with us, that we might be transformed to your presence, and be nourished for the journey ahead. Together, we pray as you taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father who art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come, thy will be done,
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
And forgive us our debts,
As we forgive our debtors;

A Service for the Worship of God MAUNDY THURSDAY April 14, 2022 Seven o'clock in the Evening



On Maundy Thursday, the church commemorates the last supper, the final meal that Jesus shared with his disciples before his betrayal. It was during this meal that, anticipating his death, Christ instituted the sacred ritual of remembrance that we now know as Holy Communion or the Eucharist. The Gospels of Mark, Matthew, and Luke identify the Last Supper as the Jewish Passover meal, thus establishing the connection between Christ and the sacrificial Passover lamb.

Christian theology has since interpreted Jesus his actions at the last supper in light of this connection to the festival of Passover; this is why he is sometimes referred to as the Paschal lamb or the Lamb of God. When he took the bread and wine of the Paschal meal and identify them as his body and blood, Jesus instituted a new feast, a new covenant between God and God's people. For this reason, one of the most important customs of the Maundy Thursday liturgy across denominational lines is the celebration of Communion.

"Maundy" is derived from the Latin word for commandment, "mandatum." It was on this day that Jesus gave his disciples what he called a "new command": "love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." Jesus's way of demonstrating this love at the Last Supper was to wash his disciples' feet and today many churches offer Maundy Thursday foot washing ceremonies. While the liturgy commemorates the institution of the sacrament of Communion, then, it also seeks to re-create the intimacy of Christ's last moments with his disciples, encouraging Christian to show others the self-sacrificing love that the Savior modeled in his last hours.

Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another.


Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.


God of love, during this Holy Week, we give you thanks for this night Jesus shared with his disciples.
