
Presbyterian Women News

OUTREACH ANNOUNCEMENTS

FPC has partnered with Neighborhood Outreach Connection (NOC) for the past three years by providing healthy snacks for children in their after-school programs at the Marsh Point and Parkview locations in Beaufort. Even during COVID, NOC's teachers and volunteers safely helped children to master skills in math and reading through tutoring, homework support, and internet-based learning. NOC statistics has shown that fourth-grade students from low-income families perform below proficiency in Reading (79%) and Math 74%).

We once again have the opportunity to support NOC by providing healthy snacks. Beginning this month (April) we humbly ask that you bring either **granola bars** (ie, Nature's Valley or other whole grain bars) and **fruit snacks** made from fruit juice/vegetables. The little red wagon will be placed outside the Education Building for drop offs during the week and will make its way across the street on Sundays. As this program will be on-going, we will change the request every month or so. Please be on the lookout for these changes and additional information about NOC.

NOC also has need of volunteers who could work either 2 or 4 hour shifts Monday to Thursday. If you would like additional information, please contact the church office and a "New Volunteer Packet" will be made available. And those of you who are teachers, there are opportunities for you to tutor the children for one hour a day Monday-Thursday. www.noc-sc.org.
