





Mayfield Mission

A group of 15 people traveled by plane, train and automobile to arrive in Mayfield, Kentucky on May 6 for a week of mission work. The town and surrounding areas were devastated in December of 2021 when an EF4 tornado ripped it apart. The devastation from the tornado was such that a Long Term Recovery Headquarters was established soon after the event due to the extent of the immense damage. The group worked tirelessly for six days doing what they were asked to do at six different work locations. Some of their efforts included siding, assembling beds, painting, demolishing a deck, cleaning yard debris and landscaping. They visited the Long Term Recovery Headquarters and with joy, they hand-delivered a check to the Lay Pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Mayfield.

Jeneane Ryan, RE, FPC Beaufort knew as soon as she learned about the tornado that she had to go and be of assistance. She has been in contact with FPC in Mayfield and others in the area for the past 18 months and her efforts to put a group together was successful.
