The children of Neighborhood Outreach Connection (NOC) at Marsh Pointe Center would like to thank you for your generosity by providing healthy snacks. The majority of these students receive free lunches at school and are ready for a snack when they arrive at NOC following their school day. Following some renovations to Parkview, both programs will be in full operation beginning in the fall, during the third week of August. When these donations are delivered, we are also adding apples and oranges.
