





HELP HAITI: The scale of the disaster facing Haiti after the 7.2 magnitude earthquake on Aug 14 is becoming clearer. The quake and its aftershocks have left at least 1,940 people dead and nearly 10,000 injured; hospitals are overwhelmed. Homes were destroyed and roads, bridges, and communication systems have been severely damaged. The UN says about 500,000 children now have limited or no access to shelter, safe water, and food.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance and its members. The PC(USA), through PDA and together with regional World Mission colleagues, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience.

OUTREACH ANNOUNCEMENTS

The children of Neighborhood Outreach Connection (NOC) at Marsh Pointe Center would like to thank you for your generosity by providing healthy snacks. As always, you went above and beyond and they now have granola bars and fruit snacks to carry them into summer. The majority of these students receive free lunches at school and are ready for a snack when they arrive at NOC following their school day. There generally 23 children who receive tutoring and assistance with their homework Monday – Thursday. This summer it is anticipated that this number will expand to around 35 as children from the Parkview Center join them. Following some renovations to Parkview, both programs will be in full operation beginning in the fall, during the third week of August. Our support is instrumental in helping the staff of NOC provide for these children. Please note that we are now collecting **Animal Crackers and Welches fruit snacks** and will continue to do so for the next 6-8 weeks at which time we will offer a new opportunity or "ask". When these donations are delivered, we are also adding apples and oranges. On behalf of the Outreach Committee, we thank you for your ongoing support of this worthy organization that serves children in need in our community.



This is a **12 week program** for **Kindergarten-5th graders** and will run **every Wednesday** starting **September 15th-December 1st** (skipping the week of Thanksgiving). Anchor Kids will be divided into three groups according to age and rotate through a variety of fun and faith-based activities each week. We hope to share much of what we learn and create with you on Sunday mornings during worship.

Our program will begin at 3:30pm and conclude at 5:30pm with a meal. Parents are welcome and encouraged to join their kid(s) to eat from 5:30-6pm. For planning purposes, We will request a mealtime headcount each week. Everything will conclude at 6pm with pickup outside of the education building.

There is a \$50 suggested donation for the 12-week program. This will cover the cost of snacks and food each week. If this creates a hardship for your family, please feel free to skip this portion of the sign up. All are welcome, regardless of the ability to pay.

Lastly, we are in need of **volunteers**. If Wednesday afternoons are open for you, please consider signing up to help assist with a group. You do not need to commit to multiple weeks to be a big help! Our nursery will be open for the younger children of volunteers.

Additionally, one family will coordinate meals each week. We will be asking the entire congregation to help fill those slots, but you are welcome to assist as well.
