For oceans that feed us.



> And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever.





Baptism is the sign and seal of our incorporation into Jesus Christ. It is one of the two sacraments practiced by the Presbyterian Church. It is administered once and leads into the sacrament of the Lord's Supper which is repeated regularly within the worship of Christ's church. Baptism connects us with God's creative purpose, cleansing power, and redemptive promise from generation to generation.
