





HELP HAITI: The scale of the disaster facing Haiti after the 7.2 magnitude earthquake on Aug 14 is becoming clearer. The quake and its aftershocks have left at least 1,940 people dead and nearly 10,000 injured; hospitals are overwhelmed. Homes were destroyed and roads, bridges, and communication systems have been severely damaged. The UN says about 500,000 children now have limited or no access to shelter, safe water, and food.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance and its members. The PC(USA), through PDA and together with regional World Mission colleagues, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience.

Acclaimed southern storyteller **Pat Conroy** (1945-2016) is best remembered as the author of a dozen beloved books, including *The Water Is Wide, The Great Santini, The Lords of Discipline*, and *The Prince of Tides*. In this free, public presentation, explore Conroy's spiritual and humanistic faith as reflected in his turbulent life and bestselling books—from his Roman Catholic upbringing to The Citadel's honor code to themes of spirituality in his writings to his life of service as a mentor to his fellow writers to his connections to his "second church," First Presbyterian Church of Beaufort. Presented by Jonathan Haupt, the executive director of the Pat Conroy Literary Center, and Holland Perryman, founder of Beaufort High School's Diversity Awareness Youth Literacy Organization, this free community outreach program is offered in collaboration between Lowcountry Presbyterian Church and the nonprofit Conroy Center.

Jonathan Haupt is the executive director of the Pat Conroy Literary Center and the former director of the University of South Carolina Press. His book reviews and author interviews have appeared in the Charleston Post and Courier, Lowcountry Weekly, Beaufort Lifestyle, Savannah Morning News Beacon magazine, and the Southern Review of Books. He is co-editor of the anthology Our Prince of Scribes: Writers Remember Pat Conroy, winner of 17 book awards.

The first intern of the Pat Conroy Conroy Literary Center, **Holland Perryman** is a senior at Beaufort High School, where she is founder of the Diversity Awareness Youth Literacy Organization and winner of the second annual Ann Head Literary Prize for Short Story. Her book reviews and author interviews have been published in the Charleston *Post and Courier, Lowcountry Weekly,* and the *Southern Review of Books*.



This is a **10** week program for Kindergarten-5th graders and will run every Wednesday starting October 6th-December 1st (skipping the week of Thanksgiving). Anchor Kids will be divided into three groups according to age and rotate through a variety of fun and faith-based activities each week. We hope to share much of what we learn and create with you on Sunday mornings during worship.

Our program will begin at 3:30pm and conclude at 5:30pm with a meal. Parents are welcome and encouraged to join their kid(s) to eat from 5:30-6pm. For planning purposes, We will request a mealtime headcount each week. Everything will conclude at 6pm with pickup outside of the education building.

There is a \$50 suggested donation for the 12-week program. This will cover the cost of snacks and food each week. If this creates a hardship for your family, please feel free to skip this portion of the sign up. All are welcome, regardless of the ability to pay.

Lastly, we are in need of **volunteers**. If Wednesday afternoons are open for you, please consider signing up to help assist with a group. You do not need to commit to multiple weeks to be a big help! Our nursery will be open for the younger children of volunteers.

Additionally, one family will coordinate meals each week. We will be asking the entire congregation to help fill those slots, but you are welcome to assist as well.
