Questions for Further Application of God’s Word:

GO DEEPER

Read Hebrews 9:1-10. Then watch the following video that shows a 3D simulation of the OT tabernacle:

What are the important components (furniture) of the OT tabernacle? What sacrifices were offered regularly? What sacrifices were offered yearly? How were these sacrifices incomplete for purifying our consciences? What were they good for if they couldn’t perfect the conscience of the worshiper?

Read Hebrews 9:11-14. What secures for us “an eternal redemption” (9:12)? Explain the term redemption. What does it mean, and how was it accomplished for us? Why did we need redemption? For help with this concept, read the following essay by Ligon Duncan:

GET PERSONAL

What does Hebrews 9:1-14 teach you about the costliness of your salvation? What does it teach you about God’s sovereign plan that goes back to the OT world? What do we learn about God’s love for us in the book of Hebrews? What evidence do we have that God truly loves those who belong to him?

PUT IT INTO PRACTICE

Why was blood necessary for the atonement of your sin? How does Hebrews 9:1-14 help us to understand the shedding of Christ’s blood for our sin? How might this impact the way that you participate in communion at your local church? Should you be joyful or sorrowful (or both) when taking communion?

ADVANCED QUESTION

In 9:7, the author of Hebrews mentions “the unintentional sins of the people.” What are these? Is it possible for a person to confess and acknowledge all of their sins? Do we need to confess all of our sins in order to be saved? What kind of payment does Jesus provide for our intentional, unintentional, past, present, and future sins?
