# Questions for further application of God's Word:

#### **GO DEEPER**

List the Christian identities in 1 Peter and describe how they shape our conduct? Describe how the conduct of Shadrach, Meschach, and Abednego was used by God, and why they refused the rule of law. (Daniel 3:1-28) Give examples of how this applies to us and our government.

## **GET PERSONAL**

When you are experiencing trials where does your conduct head? How can your identities in Christ help you? Our conduct is for God's purposes not our image. Which has been your reason for having an honorable conduct and why?

### **PUT INTO PRACTICE**

Are you surprised by the way Peter addressed the persecuted Church? Why? How would you have addressed them? Has the Church missed the mark, especially as you read 1Peter 4:19?

#### ADVANCED QUESTIONS

How does the Sermon on the Mount support what Peter said in 1 Peter? (Matthew 5:10-48) Many believe that doing good when you are done wrong is a New Testament principle based upon the life of Jesus. Use the accounts of Joseph, Daniel, and David to show that it is a biblical truth throughout the Bible.
