Questions for Further Application of God's Word:

GO DEEPER

Review the details concerning the book of Proverbs. Who wrote the book? When was it written? Why was it written? What are its major themes? Access a study Bible or commentary for help answering these questions and/or watch the Bible Project video on this book:

If the Word of God is inspired by God (literally "God-breathed" from 2 Tim 3:16), why do so many people ignore it? What are some ways that you are making God's Word (both the OT and the NT) authoritative in your life? What are some ways you can make God's Word more authoritative in your life?

What is the difference between a truism and a promise? How does that distinction change the way we read and apply the book of Proverbs? Read the following passages: Proverbs 22:6 and 15:1. How does the distinction between truism and promise help us apply these verses? Read Proverbs 26:4-5. Should we "answer a fool according to his folly" or not? How does this passage help us to apply other passages in Proverbs?

GET PERSONAL

What exactly does the "Fear of the Lord" mean? Does it mean reverence for God? Does it mean terror? Why is the Fear of the Lord the interpretational key for reading Proverbs? Would you say that you truly fear the Lord? If not, why not? If so, is that fear incompatible with love?

PUT IT INTO PRACTICE

Find a quiet spot sometime this week and read through the entire book of Proverbs in one sitting. Or you could listen to it from start to finish in about two hours (Use this link for a NIVUK reading by David Suchet: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HSvR2H6iuYM). Write out some themes

Did Jesus Christ live a life characterized by wisdom and the fear of the Lord? Why did Paul say that Christ became to us "wisdom from God" (1 Cor 1:30)? What is significant about that statement?
