## Questions for further application of God's Word:

#### **GO DEEPER**

Compare Psalm 88 with Philippians 2:14-16. What is the difference between lamenting and grumbling? Is "complaining" inherently sinful?

Read Luke 22:39-45 or Mark 14:32-42 when Jesus was in Gethsemane. How does this story reveal the character of God, and what can Jesus show us about lamenting?

### **GET PERSONAL**

What has been one of the most difficult circumstances you have faced, and how did you respond? Could you relate to Heman's cries for help, and did God seem silent through that trial?
