

WELCOME LETTER

Dear Friends,

Looking back on 2024, I am filled with immense gratitude for the resilience and dedication of our team: the Board, staff, partners, and supporters who are turning the Lab's vision into reality. Our first year as a nonprofit was full of big challenges and big progress. Like any startup, we've hit bumps in the road, but those obstacles pushed us to innovate, adapt, and build a strong foundation for the future. We're entering 2025 with continued commitment to co-creating a thriving, interconnected food system by helping small-scale farmers and food businesses—especially those led by BIPOC and first-generation immigrant entrepreneurs—sustain themselves, try new ideas, and grow.

Throughout 2024, we've expanded our team, improved our property in Bennett, expanded our outreach, and strengthened our finances. Taylor Jones joined us in June as Strategy and Administration Coordinator and my position as Executive Director was made permanent. We also added new members to our Board of Directors: Bertha Moran, Terrence Robinson, and Joe Garrett.

Our property in Bennett, CO, is looking much brighter after we hauled out 100+ cubic yards of waste! We're in the process of constructing new administrative areas to make working there easier. In addition to this, we're opening a SNAP-authorized farmstand in this location in 2025—stay tuned for more details!

Over the year, we grew and strengthened our finances by managing nearly \$1 million in grant funds for our partner farmers and food businesses, and raising \$238K in grants, donations, and earned income. These advances provide solid footing for healthy and sustainable financial growth in 2025, as we outlined in our 2025 Strategic Plan.

And not least among our accomplishments in 2024, we rolled out new branding and marketing and celebrated our first year with a dinner party at La Victoria Healing Kitchen! Our new logo and branding will be showcased throughout the coming year and beyond, and our new website and social media channels are already live!

As we look ahead to 2025, we're focused on securing planning grants that match our capacity, keeping a three-month financial cushion in the bank, building new revenue streams to reduce reliance on grants, and strengthening contract management to ensure smooth operations. With funding secured and development underway, we can manage grants, expand training programs, improve infrastructure, and build independent revenue streams. Investing in the Lab means investing in a just, resilient, and community-driven food system.

Your support—whether through funding, advocacy, or hands-on involvement—is essential to building a food system where farmers and food entrepreneurs are valued, paid fairly, and able to thrive, and where fresh, healthy food is accessible to all. Our first year has proven what's possible, and with your partnership, we will keep pushing forward to create lasting change. Thank you for believing in this vision—we couldn't do it without you.






OUR MISSION AND UISION

Partnership and Collaboration


• Strengthened key partnerships to amplify impact across farm and food business ecosystems.

A Farm Fresh, Locally Strong Food Supply Chain

The Lab operates three interconnected programs—**The Farm, The Hub,** and **The Market**—to fill gaps and address barriers to growth and sustainability across the local food supply chain. **The Farm** provides farmers with access to land, tools, and training to grow food sustainably. **The Hub** connects farmers and food businesses to essential infrastructure, such as storage and distribution, enabling them to reach larger markets. **The Market** ensures that fresh, locally grown food is accessible and affordable for the communities that need it most.

Together, these programs support farm and food businesses, strengthen local economies, and improve food access, fostering a thriving, equitable food system for all.

2024 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In our first full year of operations, the Ag & Food Lab successfully raised \$198,000 in grants and donations, demonstrating strong support for our mission. Additionally, we generated over \$40,000 in earned revenue through consulting, outreach, community engagement, and product sales—an important step toward long-term sustainability.

With a total income of **\$238,000**, we were able to offset the costs of launching our programs—The Farm, The Market, and The Hub—while covering essential administrative and fundraising expenses. Strategic investments in payroll, professional expertise, and direct community support ensured that we could provide essential resources to farm and food entrepreneurs.
