Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph December 28, 2025

“Because you are God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with heartfelt mercy, with kindness, humility, meekness and patience. Bear with one another, forgive whatever grievances you have against one another. Forgive as the Lord has forgiven you. Over all these virtues put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect. Christ’s peace must reign in your hearts.”

As the year draws to a close, rather than make new year’s resolutions we will soon forget, may I use the teaching of Paul to examine my 2025 conduct and seek ways to be sure these gifts are part and parcel of my daily living. The family of Nazareth had great difficulties and trials but surely they model the virtues spoken of in the scripture passage.

Paul’s audience was chosen by the Lord. We are chosen too but often forget how special we are. Why not consider a family which needs your prayer and support them, or one who models these virtues and imitate them. Isn’t that a great way to begin 2026. Our family living is OJT ‘on the job training.’

First Reading: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

This passage from Sirach details the duties children owe to father and mother. Their life-long devotion will not be forgotten and “will take lasting root.”

Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21

Paul urges Christians particularly in the setting of the family, to “clothe” themselves with kindness, patience, humility, and mercy; to forgive; and, above all, to love!

Gospel: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

An angel of the Lord, appearing in a dream to Joseph, urges him to flee with Jesus and Mary to Egypt to escape the murderous schemes of Herod. Later, in another dream, an angel tells Joseph to go with Jesus and Mary to a town called Nazareth in the region of Galilee, thus fulfilling the Scriptures: “He shall be called a Nazarean.”

Diocesan Annual Campaign (DAC) - Update

Good news! The parish met the goal set for us by the Bishop for the Diocesan Annual Campaign. In total, contributions of **\$49,550** have been received towards our goal of **\$40,110**. The excess of **\$9,4340**. will be refunded to the parish operating budget. Although we did have one donor who contributed **\$15,000**, this outcome was made possible by the generosity of all who made a donation to the DAC. Our parishioners are generous and together as one Body of Christ we were able to fulfill the Bishop's request.

Matching Debt Campaign

The parish met its match! In less than a year, with your determination and generosity, total funds contributed for prior school debt totaled **\$26,000**. The Diocese matched this amount which extinguished all prior school debt. Your rate of giving surpassed all expectations. Thank you for your generosity and concern for the financial health of the parish. May your blessings be tenfold. The only debt remaining is **\$45,000** on the roof loan. This type of debt did not qualify for the matching funds.



St. Monica Ministry—Update

The St. Monica Ministry held its first meetings this past week and is off to a good start. The members of this ministry are dedicated to praying for those who have left the faith. Coffee, Conversation & Catholic Social Teaching

Join us for the 1st Common Grounds gathering of 2026 on Sunday, January 11th ...6:30pm for snacks and time to find common threads among us; 7:00pm program begins in the Social Hall at Holy Spirit Catholic Church, Palmyra.

I encourage our Catholic faithful to learn more about the challenges immigrants face, to better understand the Church's teachings in this area, and to join with me, along with all people of good will, in advocating for migration policies that respect the dignity and rights of immigrants balanced with the common good of our citizens. We need to help immigrants overcome their anxieties and find their home among us in a way that allows them to be law-abiding citizens. An important part of our Christian tradition is the story of the Holy Family fleeing to Egypt to protect Jesus from the murderous wrath of King Herod. In a word, they became migrants in a foreign land.

We are not alone in navigating immigration. Two experienced Catholic advocates from TX and CA will join us virtually to discuss similarities happening across the country, join in conversation, & answer questions.



Fr. Brian Strassburger, S.J., Director of Del Camino Jesuit Border Ministries, a Jesuit project started in 2021 in south Texas, leads their mobile team visiting migrant camps, shelters, and detention centers on both sides of the U.S.-Mexico border to celebrate Mass, accompany people, and bring humanitarian aid. While in formation, he received a Master's degree in International Political

Economy and Development at Fordham University (2015).

Fr. Brian will share the reality on the U.S.-Mexico border based on his experience visiting migrant shelters and detention centers, as well as the dramatic changes during the past year.



Joining him will be **Dr. Brett Hoover**, professor of pastoral and practical theology at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles. He is a frequent presenter on immigration, ministry, and parish life at parishes and dioceses, for national Catholic organizations, and in ministry training programs. He is the author of *Immigration and Faith: Cultural, Biblical, and Theological Narratives* (Paulist Press, 2021).

Dr. Hoover will speak on dealing with the "fog of information" today and misinformation about immigrants. He will also lead us through how Catholic teaching, not politics relates to Catholic Social Doctrine on immigration and mass deportation.



The Holy Spirit Migrant Justice Ministry is happy to respond to Bishop Senior's call to educate, raise awareness, and care for the needs of our brothers and sisters in Christ by hosting a series of events called COMMON GROUNDS: Coffee, Conversation, and Catholic Social Teaching to help us come together prayerfully as Christians, using the principles of Catholic Social Teaching. COMMON GROUNDS 2026 will continue with more influencers of human services and social justice.

DAC—Cập nhật

Giáo xứ của chúng ta đã đạt được mục tiêu do Đức Giám mục đặt ra cho Chiến dịch quyên góp hàng năm của Giáo phận. Số tổng đóng góp là **49.550 USD**, vượt qua mục tiêu **40.110 USD**. Số dư **9.440 USD** sẽ được đưa vào ngân sách hoạt động của giáo xứ. Mặc dù có một nhà hảo tâm đóng góp **15.000 USD**, tuy nhiên kết quả này đạt được vẫn là nhờ sự rộng lượng của tất cả mọi người. Xin tri ân sự rộng lượng và đóng góp của mọi thành viên trong giáo xứ.

Tin Vui - Chương Trình Xóa Nợ Từ Giáo Phận
