Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 25, 2026

“From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!”. As he was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea, they were fishermen. He said to them, “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men...For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel.”

Jesus initiated His public ministry calling all to repentance and recognize the presence of the kingdom. He sought others, the brothers, to walk and work with Him, and then another pair of fishermen brothers. He desired to build His kingdom. We know how they responded.

He continues to walk among us, and the need to preach repentance and the presence of the kingdom is just as real. What if those four did not respond? How do I respond? How do I respond today?

First Reading: Isaiah 8:23—9:3

The prophet Isaiah describes the anguish of a conquered people, but he promises that they will triumph and will see a great light as on the “day of Midian.”


Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul speaks to the Corinthians with both anger and indignation because they are quarreling among themselves as to whom they should show allegiance. Some wish to follow Paul; some, Peter; others Apollos; others, Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Jesus begins his mission by going to Capernaum, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah. He selects Peter, Andrew, James and John as his disciples, inviting them to be “fishers of men.”



Feast of Saint Thomas Aquinas



For much of his childhood, Thomas Aquinas was known as the “Dumb Ox” because of his large size and slow speech. Little did his peers know they were mocking one of the greatest minds in human history. Over the 2,000-year history of Catholicism, Thomas Aquinas is among the greatest theologians and philosophers the Church has known. Many believe his intellectual contribution to be unmatched. His theological treatise *Summa Theologica* is still read in universities across the world. Brilliant as he was, Thomas was intimately aware of two important truths that elude many great minds. The first was this: The longest journey we make is from the head to the heart. It is a spiritual journey, a pilgrimage of prayer. We think of the heart as emotional, and it is, but it is also deeply spiritual. This was the second: There is a vast difference between knowing about God and knowing God. Saint Thomas Aquinas wasn’t just a brilliant mind. He was a man driven by a deep love for God. He was a man of deep prayer. And at the very center of his life, the source of his wisdom and joy, was the Eucharist. The same man who used Aristotelian philosophy to define Transubstantiation—the moment the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ—could hardly speak at times during the Mass because he was so moved when he participated in the actual miracle. Thomas Aquinas’ example invites us to ask some powerful questions about our own lives: Am I living my life from the mind? Am I living my life from the heart? Or have I found the delicate balance between the heart and the mind where love and wisdom reside? And most importantly: Do I know *about* God or do I truly *know* God? How well do I know God as a person? Am I living my life from my mind, from my heart, or have I balanced the two? I will strive to know God better, day by day.

Xin cho chúng con có tâm hồn quảng đại, mau mắn đáp lại lời mời gọi của Chúa. Xin cho chúng con biết sống một đời Kitô hữu tốt: tốt đạo, đẹp đời. Cách sống gương mẫu của chúng con là một lời loan báo sống động cho Tin Mừng cứu độ. Amen.
