Spiritual Growth

Twenty– Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 19, 2025

“I charge you in the presence of God and Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingly power, proclaim the word, be persistent, whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching...remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you have learned it.”

Although Paul wrote this letter to Timothy, why not consider it to be a message personally sent to you. We can all seek to let God’s inspired word change our lives, even at some cost, if it brings us closer to the Lord. Am I convinced that the Lord is speaking to me? Do I see something that I must change and correct in my life? Am I able to be a source of encouragement for someone else who is down or wandering?

As I hear the word and reflect upon it, remember the prophetic statement, “Speak Lord, your servant is listening .”

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.



Join us in prayer for the intentions entrusted to us by Pope Leo XIV.

For October 2025, we join the Holy Father in praying: For collaboration between different religious traditions.

Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice and human fraternity.

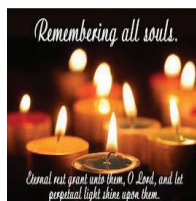

Twenty years ago, **St. John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries** to the Rosary in his apostolic letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*. These five mysteries—Christ's Baptism, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist—focus on

Jesus' public ministry and reveal him as the **Light of the world**. The St. Pope emphasized that while the Rosary is Marian in nature, it is deeply **Christ-centered**, and the Luminous Mysteries help make the Rosary a fuller reflection of the Gospel. He invited the faithful to meditate on these mysteries **on Thursdays**, as a way to deepen our encounter with Christ, the true light who leads us to salvation.

Quyên Góp Áo Ấm Mùa Đông (Từ ngày 1/10 đến ngày 9/11)

Để giúp những người có hoàn cảnh khó khăn trong mùa đông này, Catholic Worker House tổ chức chương trình quyên góp quần áo mùa đông, sẽ được phát tại Plaza San Juan Bautista vào tháng 11. Hai mươi năm trước, Thánh Giáo Hoàng Gioan Phaolô II đã giới thiệu các Mẫu Nhiệm Ánh Sáng vào Kinh Mân Côi trong tông thư **Rosarium Virginis Mariae** (Kinh Mân Côi của Đức Trinh Nữ Maria). Năm mẫu nhiệm này gồm: Bí tích Rửa Tội của Chúa Giêsu, Tiệc Cưới tại Cana, Công Bố Nước Trời, Biển Hình và Thành Lập Bí Tích Thánh Thể. Những mẫu nhiệm này tập trung vào sứ vụ công khai của Chúa Giêsu và cho thấy Ngài là Ánh Sáng của thế gian. Ngài nhấn mạnh rằng dù Kinh Mân Côi chủ yếu về Đức Mẹ, nhưng thật sự Chúa Kitô mới là trung tâm của Kinh Mân Côi, và các Mẫu Nhiệm Ánh Sáng giúp cho Kinh Mân Côi trở nên phản ánh Tin Mừng cách trọn vẹn hơn. Ngài cũng mời gọi mọi người cầu nguyện và suy niệm về những mẫu nhiệm này vào **các ngày thứ Năm**, để làm sâu sắc thêm cuộc gặp gỡ với Chúa Kitô, Đấng là ánh sáng thật dẫn đưa chúng ta đến ơn cứu độ. Thánh Gioan Phaolô II nhấn mạnh rằng: **“Kinh Mân Côi là lời cầu nguyện yêu thích của tôi.”**
