Spiritual Growth

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
October 5, 2025

"I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake, but bear your share of the hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God." "...increase our faith..."

On a daily basis, we need reminders—of appointments, bills to pay, meetings to attend. But how about the reminder Paul sends to his son Timothy—not to forget to use the gift he had been given?

In our time, we are surrounded by raging wildfires, taking lives, destroying property, and exhausting the heroes who fight them. The image of the flame we have received through Baptism and Confirmation is the grace and power of which the Apostle speaks: to encourage, to motivate, and to make the presence of the Lord felt and known in our world.

Maybe this is the last and only reminder you will receive.

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.

Parish Financial Report

The parish finance council is happy to included in today bulletin the parish financial report for the year ended **June 30, 2025**. It was a year filled with generosity. Our parish is truly blessed. Some high-lights include:

- A bequest from the estate of Bill Springer, II, I for **\$268,000**.
- A DAC contribution of **\$20,000** which allowed the parish to meet its goal and enjoy a refund of **\$16,000**.
- Rental income of **\$63,000**
- Diocesan payments on former school debt of **\$19,000**
- The income exceeded the budget by some **\$300,000**, the operating expenses exceeded the budget by only **\$21,000**.
- The parish was able to update the men's bathroom on the first floor.
- In total **\$27,000** was paid on the debt from parishioner's contribution. When we include the Diocese's payments, a total of **\$46,000** was paid towards the parish debt
- The parish debt balance has been reduced to **\$61,014**.

SUY NIỆM LỜI CHÚA THƯỜNG NIÊN XXVII

Trong Tin Mừng hôm nay, khi các tông đồ xin Chúa Giêsu thêm đức tin, các ông nghĩ rằng nếu có thêm đức tin, thì mọi sự sẽ được xuôi chảy mà không còn gì là khó khăn. Nhưng Chúa chỉ cho các ông thấy không cần phải có thêm đức tin, nhưng là cần một đức tin có phẩm chất, nghĩa là một đức tin vững mạnh và kiên trì. Vì người có đức tin vững mạnh thì không tin nhầm nhai vào bói quẻ, vào tướng số, vào ngày lành tháng tốt, không xiêu bên này vẹo bên kia. Nếu có niềm tin vững mạnh, thì Thánh Phaolô Tông Đồ dân ngoại thúc giục chúng ta, hãy mạnh dạn mà loan báo điều mình đã tin, điều mình đã lãnh nhận, hãy công bố cho muôn dân biết Thiên Chúa quyền năng và vinh hiển. Vì như tiên tri Habacúc nói rằng: “người công chính sẽ sống được nhờ trung tín”, nghĩa là chúng ta phải có ơn bền đỗ trong niềm tin ấy.



CHÚA NHẬT XXVI THƯỜNG NIÊN

Bài Đọc I: Kb 1, 2-3; 2, 2-4

“Người công chính sẽ sống được nhờ trung tín”.

Trích sách Tiên tri Khabacúc.

Lạy Chúa, con kêu cầu Chúa cho đến bao giờ mà Chúa không nghe? Con phải ức ép kêu lên cùng Chúa, mà Chúa không cứu con sao? Có sao Chúa tỏ cho con thấy sự gian ác và lao khổ, cướp bóc và bắt lương trước mặt con? Dù có công lý, nhưng kẻ đối nghịch vẫn thắng. Chúa đáp lại tôi rằng: “Hãy chép điều con thấy, hãy khắc nó vào tấm bảng, để đọc được dễ dàng. Bởi hình lạ còn xa, nó sẽ xuất hiện trong thời sau hết, và sẽ chẳng hư không. Nó kết duyên với người, hãy chờ đợi nó, vì nó sẽ đến không trì hoãn. Chắc chắn nó sẽ đến, không sai. Người không có lòng ngay thì ngã gục, nhưng người công chính sẽ sống nhờ trung tín”.

Đó là lời Chúa.

Bài Đọc II: 2 Tm 1, 6-8, 13-14

“Con chớ hổ thẹn làm chứng cho Chúa chúng ta”.

Trích thư thứ hai của Thánh Phaolô Tông đồ gửi cho Timôthê

Con thân mến, cha khuyên con hãy làm sống lại ơn Thiên Chúa đã ban cho con do việc đặt tay của cha. Vì chung, Thiên Chúa không ban cho chúng ta một thần khí nhát sợ, mà là thần khí dũng mạnh, bác ái và tiết độ. Vậy con chớ hổ thẹn làm chứng cho Chúa chúng ta, và cho cha nữa, là tù nhân của Người, nhưng con hãy đồng lao cộng tác với cha vì Tin Mừng, nhờ quyền năng của Thiên Chúa.

Con hãy lấy những lời lành lẽ phải, con đã nghe cha nói, làm mẫu mực trong đức tin và lòng mến nơi Đức Giêsu Kitô. Con hãy cậy nhờ Thánh Thần là Đấng ngự trong chúng ta mà gìn giữ kho tàng tốt đẹp.

Đó là lời Chúa.

Phúc Âm: Lc 17, 5-10

“Nếu các con có lòng tin”.

Tin Mừng Chúa Giêsu Kitô theo Thánh Luca.

Khi ấy, các Tông đồ thưa với Chúa Giêsu rằng: “Xin Thầy ban thêm lòng tin cho chúng con”. Chúa liền phán rằng: “Nếu các con có lòng tin bằng hạt cải, thì dẫu các con khiến cây dâu này rằng: ‘Hãy bứng rễ lên mà đi trồng dưới biển’, nó liền vâng lời các con. “Ai trong các con có người đầy tớ cày bừa hay chăn súc vật ngoài đồng trở về, liền bảo nó rằng: ‘Mau lên, hãy vào bàn dùng bữa’, mà trái lại không bảo nó rằng: ‘Hãy lo dọn bữa tối cho ta, hãy thắt lưng và hầu hạ ta cho đến khi ta ăn uống đã, sau đó người mới ăn uống’. Chớ thì chủ nhà có phải mang ơn người đầy tớ, vì nó đã làm theo lệnh ông dạy không? Thầy nghĩ rằng: không. Phần các con cũng vậy, khi các con làm xong mọi điều đã truyền dạy các con, thì các con hãy nói rằng: “Chúng tôi là đầy tớ vô dụng, vì chúng tôi đã làm điều chúng tôi phải làm”.

Đó là lời Chúa.
