The Power In My Pain

I didn't think change would feel like this, like I'm finally living a life that fits. Like I can breathe, stand tall, feel free, like I'm finally someone I'm proud to be.

I came from a toxic family, bad friends too, pain I thought I'd never get through. Rape, hard drugs, nights with no lights, homeless, hopeless, stuck in a fight.

Most days I acted quiet and low, but underneath, anger was ready to blow. Always mad, never knew how, but now I'm learning to deal with it now.

I felt lost more times than I can say, invisible, and thrown away.

Friends turned cold, trust got thin, felt like I was drowning deep within.

Writing was the one thing that stayed true, a way to breathe when nothing else would do.

Pouring my pain into zines I made, trying to heal with every word I laid.

Then I showed up at the Safehouse door, broken and tired, couldn't take no more. But Catholic Social Services didn't just see a broken girl - they saw all of me and much more.

They gave me a bed and a place to stay, but more than that, they helped me find my way.

Workers who listened, who didn't give up, who let me choose my own path, and fill my own cup.

They didn't push or rush me ahead, they stayed steady, kept me from feelings of dread.

Through Turning Points I found my worth.
I'm more than the pain I was birthed, allowed to want better, want more, learning to walk through any kind of storm.

I'm not perfect, still learning every day, but I've got a voice and I'm learning how to find my way.

Speaking up loud for what I need, standing strong, planting my seed.

I've got workers who got my back, that's true, but I'm learning how to fight for me too.

Trusting myself, feeling real, building a life that I can feel.

This is a thank you, a real one too, for helping me see what I could and can do, for catching me when I thought I'd fall, for showing me I could have it all.

This journey's mine but you helped me start, and I will always and forever, continue to carry you all deep in my heart.

# The Cookie Monster & The Stanley Milner



slide into November like an otter. Wild and free with no fear of falling.



# **AN INTERVIEW WITH**

# NINE IBON VIOLENCE

The editor of Zine & HEARD heard Nine Iron Violence play at the iHuman Art Walk in September, loved their energy, and assigned me this story. It was great to interview the people in the band and here is what I found out.

# HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN TOGETHER?

Since March of 2025. - Axl

# TELL US ABOUT YOUR BAND NAME.

We needed a rebrand after our singer left the band so I threw a couple names together, pitched them to the band and yeah. - Axl

It took Aaron a lot of convincing. - Freya

It did but as soon as I saw it on a poster with the logo Axl designed I was like yeah, this is it. - Aaron

# HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE YOUR MUSIC?

Our sound is derivative of new metal, I notice we tie in a lot of hardcore elements like new metal, a bit of thrash metal here and there so our genre would be more defined as new-hardcore. - Axl

Yea I guess you can call it that, because we keep changing members and we got a new lead guitarist like a month ago the sound is adapting and changing, every couple weeks it's a little different than it was before but I think that was a good description. - Freya

## WHERE DO YOU COME UP WITH IDEAS FOR SONGS?

It's mostly me and Freya sitting in the basement before everyone's here. I have a lot of trauma so it's mostly based on that and we just sit down and write, pitch it to everyone else and boom new songs. A few of them came out of some afterparty drunkenness. - Axl

Yea to add onto that there are a few songs that're kind of random like – Trains is where I'm going with this, Trains is a song about taking the train, me and Axl were taking the Valley Line and recorded the beeps the train makes when the doors open, and that's the riff of the song. - Freya

That song lyrically, we drew inspiration from Deftones. - Axl

Oh yea for sure. - Freya

WHO WAS YOUR ORIGINAL INSPIRATION TO PLAY MUSIC?

Mine is Metallica, James Hetfield, all that stuff. My hero's. - Axl

It's kind of funny how I started playing drums but I did play guitar for about a year, I was so young I honestly don't remember what made me want to. I think I was just like I want to do this, but eventually I had friends in the 7th grade who formed a band and were like we need a drummer so I signed up for lessons, and a month later I was in the worst band ever. My inspiration is probably Korn. - Freya

I suppose my biggest inspiration would be Rellik: Signal from Earth – my dad. He's also an artist and has done a lot of music so I've been around a lot of musicians my whole life. Even Q – he was another big inspiration of mine, seeing Q on the drums since I was 13. - Aaron

For me the reason I got into playing guitar was because ever since I was a kid I watched my dad play guitar and blast it through the entire house until I went to sleep. I also got into drumming because of a movie on the Disney channel. The main character played the drums and at the end there was this giant talent show and the main character was crushing on this girl for the whole movie, so at the talent show he played a sick drum solo and the girl was like "I want you" and I was like I wanna do that! - Ethan

HARDEST PART ABOUT KEEPING A BAND TOGETHER?

Keeping members honestly, especially singers. - Axl

Yea showing up is a big part, it's just consistency. - Aaron

You just need members who're really passionate about what they do and having good chemistry in the band. - Freya

WHAT'S THE SCENE LIKE IN EDMONTON?

Good sometimes, bad other times, mostly welcoming. The fans get very gate-keepy and rude sometimes. - Axl

Yea if they hear things about certain members or a band they might not go to the show. - Freya

Or cancel the band entirely. - Axl

Yea we almost had that happen a while ago. - Freya

Otherwise the show scene is pretty good, the bands get along pretty well. -

DO YOU HAVE ANY RELEASES OR GIGS COMING UP?

We do have one release on Soundcloud and Youtube right now, it's our single and it's called Brain Death – it's just a demo version at this time. - Axl


