These simple calendars have largely been replaced with large cardboard boxes with plastic trays behind them. 1 Each numbered door opens to reveal a pre-Christmas treat. You can have a **Ted Baker** Advent Calander 'Filled with deluxe, full-sized and limited edition beauty and bathing treats to indulge in from head to toe.' £46. There is a Ferrero **Collection** Advent Calander with a tempting description of 'Delicate layers of wafer, an elegant velvety centre and a toasted almond, all finished with a sprinkling of coconut.' You can have the 'Grind' Calander so that you can 'Count down to Christmas with 25 days of Nespresso® compatible compostable coffee pods, each a unique blend of ethically-sourced speciality coffee.' £28. Many of the calanders, such as 'Tony's Chocolonely Countdown Calendar' and Lynx thoughtfully have removed any reference to Advent and Christmas so that I won't be offended. But they will tell me about their commitment to ethical sourcing. Thank you.
