Amen! Which means I believe. If receiving on the tongue, the communicant opens their mouth and extends their tongue onto which the minister places the Host. If receiving in the hand, the communicant places their "writing hand" under their other hand into which the minister places the Host. Then using their "writing hand," the communicant places the Host into their mouth. Please remember that what we receive are the Body and Blood of Christ. It is incorrect to call the Sacred Species the bread and wine and displays a level of ignorance about what is offered at this most holy time. Return to your seat and give quiet thanks to God.

The Holy Name of Jesus

In the commandments given to Mose on Mount Sinai, and handed down to us, we are told to honor the name of God.
