Understanding the Mass The Eucharistic Prayer

The Rite of Communion—

The Agnus Dei—*The Lamb of God* is a 7th C addition to the Mass. Sung or recited during the Breaking of the Bread, it is an acclamation that provides the faithful another opportunity to praise God for the sacrifice of His Son, the Lamb of God, which has won for us the gift of salvation. Quietly the priest prays: *Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, free me by this, your most holy Body and Blood, from all my sins and from every evil; keep me always faithful to your commandments and never let me be departed from you.* As a sign of reverence, he genuflects. **Elevation of the Body and Blood**—Having prayerfully prepared his own heart, the priest raises the Host and Chalice and proclaims: *Behold the Lamb of God; behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.* The word be-

hold or in Latin *Ecce* should bring to mind several Scripture passages. The first, in the Gospel of John—John the Baptist points to Jesus and says “*Behold the Lamb of God.*” Then, also in the Gospel of John—Pontius Pilate presents Jesus to the jeering crowd saying “*Behold the man!*” And on Good Friday we say “*Behold the wood of the cross.*” The word “behold” has us fix our gaze on depths of a mystery—in which is revealed God’s love for us. The only possible response—*Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.* Like the many



sinner Jesus welcomed to his table, so we are welcomed.

The Poor Souls in Purgatory

Following the feast of All Saints, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Souls on November 2. This celebration remembers all the souls who have died and have not yet attained Heaven, who are still atoning for the sins in their lives. The faithful still living can help these souls reach heaven through prayers, especially with the offering of a Mass.

The Catholic Church has always prayed for the dead, but the feast of All Souls is an annual recognition of this tradition. As early as the sixth century, Benedictine monasteries held commemoration ceremonies for their deceased members. In the 11th century, St Odilo of Cluny chose the day after All Saints' Day in his decree that Masses should be offered for the dead, and alms given to the poor. This custom spread to other monasteries and eventually to the Church around the world.

Purgatory is presented by the Church as an experience of penance that takes place after death, by which the soul is liberated from the burden of sin so that we might more readily participate in the mystery of heaven. Words like punishment and purification are frequently used as points of reference for what the soul endures as a result of the experience of Purgatory.

All Souls' Day is a day for remembering all the faithful departed in Purgatory who died with the guilt of lesser sins on their souls. The Roman Catholic doctrine holds that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help cleanse their souls.

Catholic Campaign for Human Development Collection

On November 18-19, our parish will take up a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. More than 37 million people in the United States live in poverty. This collection supports programs that empower people to identify and address the obstacles they face in bringing permanent and positive change to their communities. In addition, 25% of the donations stay here in the Archdiocese of Louisville to fund antipoverty programs throughout our 24 counties.
