Dear Beloved of Christ,

This week, the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi. It is the second of three 'doctrinal' celebrations that follow the historical feast of Pentecost. The first of the feasts was last week, the Holy Trinity. This Friday we celebrate the feast of the Sacred Heart – the revelation of Jesus' heart, still beating with love for humanity. Corpus Christi as a formal feast was instituted by Pope Urban IV and Clement V in the late 1200s after the Eucharistic Miracle at Lanciano, Italy, where a piece of the Host consecrated at Mass transformed into the flesh of the human heart in the 700s. Throughout the centuries, numerous investigations have been conducted into the miracle. In the 1970s and 1980s, medical doctors examined the Sacred Species with the most advanced medical technology at the time. Their findings (available at www.therealpresence.org), discovered that the Sacred Species is part of the muscular tissue of the heart and the Professor who examined the heart made the observation that "only a very expert hand (hardly known in the middle ages) in anatomical dissection could have tangentially cut through the surface of a hollow organ so neatly to obtain such a thin cross section or "slice" from a cadaveric heart."

On the front cover of our bulletin, you will see a wonderful piece of art by the painter Raphael from 1510-11, in a room of a chapel near the Sistine Chapel in Rome. On one wall, he painted the famous fresco known as "The School of Athens," where one sees Plato and Aristotle in the foreground, surrounded by many of the scholars of the secular pagan world. On the opposite wall, Raphael painted a mirror image – the image on the front cover known as "The Disputation of the Holy Sacrament." At the center, on the altar, we see a host in a monstrance (similar to what you will see at our procession). Around the Altar and Blessed Sacrament on earth, you see many different priests, bishops, popes, and scholars, including St. Jerome, St. Thomas, St. Ambrose, St. Leo, and Dante Alighieri, the author of The Divine Comedy. There are men and women looking at the Host in prayer (the Franciscan friar poking his head from behind the altar always makes me chuckle and the Benedictine on the far side who sees into heaven!). On the ground, you see a representation of all of the books of Christian life: Morality, the Letters of Paul, and Augustine's "On the City of God." Between earth and heaven, we see the Holy Spirit surrounded by angels holding the four books of the Gospels and their first words. Above that in heaven, Christ sits in glory, surrounded by John the Baptist and His Mother with the early Christian saints mixed in with the kings and prophets of the Old Testament and above that, God the Father surrounded by the angels and archangels, principalities and powers, thrones and dominions of Heaven. In this piece, we see the reality of all we have in the Faith: the Lord of Heaven and earth coming down among us, dwelling substantially in our midst. Come, let us adore Him!

This week, the diocese's priests are on their annual convocation. Please pray for us as we get together to discuss vocations and share some time together! Thank you to Fr. Ed Hoffman, who will celebrate at 7:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Please note there is no Mass on Thursday, but there will be confessions.

Queridos Amados de Cristo,

Esta semana, la Iglesia celebra la festividad de Corpus Christi. Es la segunda de tres celebraciones doctrinales que siguen a la histórica fiesta de Pentecostés. La primera de las fiestas fue la semana pasada, la de la Santísima Trinidad. Este viernes celebramos la fiesta del Sagrado Corazón: la revelación del corazón de Jesús, que aún late con amor por la humanidad. Corpus Christi, como fiesta formal, fue instituido por los papas Urbano IV y Clemente V a finales del siglo XIII tras el Milagro Eucarístico de Lanciano, Italia, donde un trozo de la Hostia consagrada en la Misa se transformó en la carne de un corazón humano en el siglo VIII. A lo largo de los siglos, se han realizado numerosas investigaciones sobre este milagro. En las décadas de 1970 y 1980, los médicos examinaron las Sagradas Especies con la tecnología médica más avanzada de la época. Sus hallazgos (disponibles en www.therealpresence.org) revelaron que la Especie Sagrada forma parte del tejido muscular del corazón, el profesor que lo examinó, observó que «solo una mano experta (hecho poco conocido en la Edad Media) en disección anatómica podría haber cortado tangencialmente la superficie de un órgano hueco con tanta precisión para obtener una sección transversal tan fina o «rebanada» de un corazón cadavérico».

En la portada de nuestro boletín, encontrarán una maravillosa obra de arte del pintor Rafael, realizada entre 1510 y 1511, en una sala de una capilla cercana a la Capilla Sixtina en Roma. En una de las paredes, pintó el famoso fresco conocido como «La Escuela de Atenas», donde se ven a Platón y Aristóteles en primer plano, rodeados de numerosos eruditos del mundo pagano secular. En la pared opuesta, Rafael pintó una imagen especular: la imagen de la portada, conocida como «La Disputa del Santísimo Sacramento». En el centro, sobre el altar, vemos una hostia en una custodia (similar a la que verán en nuestra procesión). Alrededor del altar y del Santísimo Sacramento en la tierra, se ven numerosos sacerdotes, obispos, papas y eruditos, entre ellos San Jerónimo, Santo Tomás, San Ambrosio, San León y Dante Alighieri, autor de La Divina Comedia. Hay hombres y mujeres contemplando la hostia en oración (el fraile franciscano que asoma la cabeza desde detrás del altar siempre me hace reír, y el benedictino al otro lado, que ve el cielo). En el suelo, se ve una representación de todos los libros de la vida cristiana: Moralidad, las Cartas de Pablo y "Sobre la Ciudad de Dios" de Agustín. Entre la tierra y el cielo, vemos al Espíritu Santo rodeado de ángeles que sostienen los cuatro libros de los Evangelios y sus primeras palabras. Por encima de eso, en el cielo, Cristo se sienta en gloria, rodeado de Juan el Bautista y su Madre, con los primeros santos cristianos mezclados con los reyes y profetas del Antiguo Testamento, y por encima de eso, Dios Padre rodeado de los ángeles y arcángeles, principados y potestades, tronos y dominios del Cielo. En esta pieza, vemos la realidad de todo lo que tenemos en la fe: el Señor del Cielo y de la tierra descendiendo entre nosotros, morando sustancialmente en medio de nosotros. ¡Vengan, adorémoslo!

Esta semana, los sacerdotes de la diócesis están en su convocatoria anual. Por favor, oren por nosotros mientras nos reunimos para hablar sobre las vocaciones y compartir tiempo juntos. Gracias al Pr. Ed Hoffman, por celebrar las misas a las 7:30 a. m. el lunes, martes y miércoles. No habrá Misa el jueves, pero si habrá Confesión.
