

**Lockwood Board of Aldermen Regular Session Minutes**

- A. Justin Weimer made a motion to approve the agenda for May 21st, 2026, regular session meeting. Perry Ellis seconded the motion. Motion carried by roll call 3-0.

**V. Approval of Minutes**

- A. Justin Weimer made a motion to approve the Regular Session Minutes for April 16<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Neal Sands seconded. Motion carried by roll call 3-0.

**VII. Business**

- A. Wayne West presented to the council an idea of forming a junior council. He met with the Lockwood Schools Superintendent, Clay Lasater and they were working out the details to add to the school's clubs or curriculum, he was unsure of the details. He said they would like to start it in August, so the council needs to decide by the June 18<sup>th</sup> meeting if they want to participate.
- B. The council decided to do mosquito spraying semi-monthly on the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month weather permitting.
- C. Neals Sands made a motion to fix the Welcome to Lockwood signs coming into the city and renew the permits. Justin Weimer seconded the motion. Motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.
- D. The council decided that changing the South Park name was not something they wanted to do at this time, but they did instruct Isaac to get some bids on some playground equipment in honor of Tucker Berry.
- E. Isaac said he had spoken with David Hammon about the completion of the dog pound and it will be finished by June 1<sup>st</sup> weather permitting.
- F. Phil Greathouse, city attorney, will investigate dog kennel ordinances and present them to the council at a later date.
- G. The council was not interested in adding more restrictions to the vicious dog ordinance.

- H. Junior Moenning owner of BSW trash service spoke with the council about the trash trucks leaving water substances on the streets. He explained how come this happens and said he would appreciate them reaching out to him in the future before blindsiding him with being placed on the agenda. The mayor assured him there was no ill intent meant. Neal Sands had just wanted to discuss the issue with the rest of the council and had asked the city clerk to put it on the agenda.
- I. Neal Sands made a motion to put the city's surplus equipment up for bid. Isaac Dodd will get descriptions of the items and Joy Finley will place ads for sealed bids. Perry Ellis seconded the motion. Motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.
- J. Table Library minutes until June meeting when all raises will be discussed.
- K. The council will have a work session on June 2, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.
- L. Justin Weimer made a motion to put banking accounts out for bids in compliance with state statutes. Perry Ellis seconded the motion. Motion carried by roll call 3-0.
- M. Neal Sands made a motion to pay city bills. Perry Ellis seconded the motion. Motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.

#### **VIII. Departmental Reports**

- A. City Superintendent, Isaac Dodd, informed the council that the pool would open May 25<sup>th</sup>. He will have the lead pipe inventory completed soon with only 8 locations left and then he will send it to the engineers at HBK.
- B. Sheriff Robison could not attend this meeting. Deputy Eric Carrier was present and said he didn't have a formal report from the sheriff but that he could tell them what he had done inside the city when he was on patrol. He said it had been fairly quiet a few domestic calls.
- C. Mayor Schilling informed the council that the pool had six lifeguards and the pool manager to operate the swimming pool this year. Mayor Schilling enacted a few new forms to try and keep swimmer safer.
- D. Joy Finley, City Clerk, gave the mayor and each council member Junior Moenning's phone number at his bequest and discussed what she would go over at the work session on June 2<sup>nd</sup> for the budget.
- E. City Attorney, Phil Greathouse had nothing new.
- F. Alderman, Perry Ellis notice no handicap signs at Smith Park and wanted Isaac Dodd to put some up. Neal Sands said he was going to discuss widening the driveway where the recycle trailer sits.
