MENS CLUB UPDATE from Roger Pierce and Rich Rosenberg

July ended with WGCs biggest event - the Melnick and Sons 5-Person Best Ball competition. We would like to extend our congratulations to Men's Club member Ed Carrigan who got his first ever hole-in-one on 17. Way to go Ed!

On July 11, 23 players came out for the, Stableford Team Total competition. 4-some team scores were the total Stableford points earned by all players on each team. The winners, receiving a sleeve of balls each, were Roger Pierce, Gary Boonstra, Tom Ford and Rodney Grisby with 74 points, equating to a team total of two under par. Tom had the KP on #2 at 12' 9" and Rodger Johnson had the KP on #7 at 21'; each KP winner received a sleeve of balls. The Honey Pot was Canadian Skins worth \$28 each and went to David Dimatteo for a net Eagle on 3, Tyler Crawford for a Birdie on 7 and Rich Rosenberg for a net Eagle on 9. Another skin went to first-time player Spencer San Bento. Spencer crushed his drive into the greenside bunker on 5 and then holed out for Eagle resulting in a net zero!

Our annual Men's Club Chapman competition was held on July 24. Both players on the teams of two hit drives and then switched balls for the second shot. After the second shots, the team chose which ball to play and then alternated hitting shots until the ball was holed. Two teams tied for first and received a sleeve of balls each: George Schmidt & Ty Tyson and Rodger Johnson & Tyler Crawford. The third place team of Keith Snavely and Pat Ford received one ball each. KPs worth a sleeve of balls went to Roger Pierce on #2 (11'4") and Ty Tyson on #7 (23'10"). A total of seven, \$10 team skins were awarded. Four went to George Schmidt & Ty Tyson for an Eagle on 1, a Birdie on 4, a Birdie on 7 and a Birdie on 9; two went to Rodger Johnson & Tyler Crawford for an Eagle on 3 and a Birdie on 9; one went to Keith Snavely and Pat Ford for an Eagle on 6.

Our next event on August 7th will be a "Mr. Piggy" contest. Each guy is given a title of Diamond, Heart, Club, or Spade, and each hole designates whose score is taken. On August 21st Blind Draw 2-somes won't know who their partner is until the end of the competition. It will be regular golf using the Stableford scoring system. All competitions will have an optional \$5 Honey Pot.

We encourage you to try these bimonthly Thursday afternoon events. It's a great opportunity to meet, mingle and compete with members you don't normally play with. All Men golfers (members or not) are invited to play in any of our events. The cost is \$15 for WGC members and \$30 for non-WGC members which includes Green Fees. As always, at the conclusion of the competition, we meet up in the bar for dinner, drinks, and camaraderie. Come join us for a fun afternoon and evening.

The race to the Red Barn Cup is a season-long competition where players receive points each week based on how their team finished. The total of the best 7 scores of the possible 16 will be used to determine the winners. After 10 events, the top 10 leaders are shown below.
