MENS CLUB UPDATE

2025's first two months of WGC Men's Club competitions are complete with a total of 42 different players participating in at least one of the events. Our two April events were on the 3rd (Progressive Tees) and the 24th (3-Club Challenge). We would like to thank Rodger Johnson, Tom Ford and Jim Phay for helping with the registration, which greatly facilitated the process. George Schmidt, Dylan Lee, Tom Ford and Pat Ford cruise to victory in Progressive Tees.

The Progressive Tees was our biggest field of the year so far with 22 players participating. It was a 2-net competition of the 4-some and the first place team (3 balls each) won by 5 strokes over 3 teams (1 ball each) that tied for second. KPs on #2, #7 were worth 3 balls each and went to Jim Phay and Dan Caufman. Our \$5 cash side game was Net Skins worth \$35 cash each and went to Nick Krantz for a 3 on #1, Pat Ford for a 3 on #3 and Roger Pierce for a 2 on #6 (net double eagle!) Gordon Sears, Rodger Johnson and Bernie Upchurch easily won the 3-Club Challenge.

Our April 24, 3—Club Challenge drew 20 players who were divided into 7, 3-man teams. Each competed with only three clubs of their choice. Stableford scoring was used to determine the 2 best scores. It was very challenging, and the first-place trio (3 balls each) scored 40 points, while the other 6 teams' scores were between 29 and 34. Rodger Johnson shot a 6 over, 42 using a hybrid, 7 iron and pitching wedge and commented that this was better than the 46 he shot using all 14 clubs the previous day. KPs on #2 and #7 were worth 3 balls each and went to Scott Bader and Jim Phay. Our \$5 cash side game was Net Skins, and paid \$30 each to Shaun Hohenstein, Mike Prewitt and Bill Johnson.

Race to the Red Barn Cup

The race to the Red Barn Cup is a season-long competition where players receive points each week based on how their team finished. For details see the March Newsletter. The total of the best 7 scores of the possible 16 will be used to determine who will receive prizes (clubhouse credit) and the trophy - all awarded at the Go Low Tournament dinner on Nov 15. Early season top 5 leaders (and ties) are Pat Ford (48), Tom Ford (47), Germ Geragotelis (42), George Schmidt (39), Rodger Johnson (32.5) and Gordon Sears (32.5); point totals are in parentheses.

On May 8 we will have a Horse Race, like the ones prior to the Men's Invitational (May 24-25) and the Five Person Best Ball (July 26-27). About the only difference for the Men's Club is that no team will be eliminated until at least 5 holes have been played. This will be a great chance to practice for the upcoming Invitational Horse Race. Our other May competition will be a Scramble on the 22nd.

All Men golfers (WGC members or not) are invited to play in any of our events. The cost is \$15 for WGC members and \$30 for non-WGC members which includes Green Fees. Each event will have an optional \$5 Honey Pot with cash payout, and as always, each competition is followed by an optional dinner/social/awards presentation up in the restaurant/bar.

During April, 17 ladies took the Challenge 36. Here are the winners of each Division:


DIVISION 1 at 30 Yards - 5 competitors

Thursday, May 8, 2025— 5:00 Shotgun.
Format: Horse Race (Blind Draw for Teams)
OPEN TO ALL MEN (WGC MEMBERS OR NOT)

If you have never tried a horse race before, you need to do this one. It's a blast. Random teams of two will be formed by the Pro Shop. All teams will be playing the same hole at the same time. We will be playing holes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, and 9. It's an alternate shot format where the high handicapper will tee off on odd numbered holes and the low handicapper will tee off on even numbered holes. A cumulative score will be kept for the first five holes. Then, the scores for the five lowest net teams will be zeroed out and they will compete on Hole 9 for all the marbles!!

KPs on #2 (Low Handicappers) and #7 (High Handicappers) \$5 Cash Honey Pot—Team Skins (Both Men Must Enter)

Format: Scramble (9 Holes)
OPEN TO ALL MEN (WGC MEMBERS OR NOT)

Entry Fee-- \$15 WGC Members, \$30 Non-WGC Members (includes greens fee)

3-somes or 4-somes will be formed by the Pro Shop (Depending on Numbers).

Players may play from tee of his choice with appropriate handicap calculation.

Standard Scramble Format: All players hit a drive on each hole. The Team will choose the best drive and all players will hit second shot from that spot. Then choose best second shot and all players play from that spot. Continue in this fashion until the ball is holed out. Each team must use at least one drive from each player.

Optional \$5 Cash Honey Pot— Canadian Skins. (All team members must enter to be eligible) KPs on #2 and #7 for a sleeve of balls each.
