MENS CLUB UPDATE from Roger Pierce and Rich Rosenberg

The club's final two events of the year were held in October. Our Championship tournament was held on the 9th and on the 23rd we held our inaugural glow ball tournament.

The Men's Club Championship drew 23 players and was dominated by Robert Clemmer. Not only did Robert win the Championship (6 balls and a new putter), but he also won KPs on #2 (19'1") and #7 (9'9") and received 3 balls for each one. He also won 2 skins with a net Birdie on 2 and a net Eagle on 7. Steve Anderson came in second (3 balls), Pat Ford was third (2 balls) and Germ Geragotelis and Dan Caufman tied for fourth (1 ball each). The other KP went to Dallas Leavitt on #9 (8'5") and the other skins went to Joe Burgin (net Eagle on 5) and Doug Dumford (net Eagle on 6).

Our final event was aglow ball tournament played on the back 9 with a 6:15 starting time. All the fairways, greens and hazards were delineated with LED markers. It was attended by 24 players (8 threesomes) who had a lot of fun watching their balls travel through the night sky. First place went to the team of Dallas Leavitt, Jonas Leavitt and James Shoemaker (6 balls each), second went to the team of Dave Phay, Dave Amirehteshami and Kyle Sorenson (3 balls each) and two teams tied for third and received two balls each. Team net skins (\$26) were awarded to Justin Gaerdes, Scott Bader and Dave Acton (Eagle on 14); Dave Phay, Dave Amirehteshami and Kyle Sorenson (Birdie on 17); Germ Geragotelis, Rich Rosenberg and Brian Nelson (Eagle on 10); Steve Anderson, Roger Pierce and John Bathurst (Birdie on 13).

The race to the Red Barn Cup is over. The top 3 finishers will receive monetary prizes and the winner will receive the trophy (hand crafted by Steve Anderson) at our Awards Celebration on Nov. 6. In addition trophies will be given to the player who played in

the most events (Iron Horse), the player who won the most balls (He's Got Balls) and the player who won the most cash (Cash Cow). Appetizers will be served and men who have played in at least 4 events will receive a free drink. Following the ceremony a raffle will be held for three, \$100 gift cards. The winners will be reported in the December Newsletter.



Dear Readers,

As it stands right now, the plan is to transition the **WGC Fairway News** from a PDF-based newsletter, into a web-based newsletter. In non-technical speak, that means you will receive an email every month with a number of interesting articles, promotions, and events happening at Whidbey Golf Club, and when you select to read the ones that pique your interest, you will be seamlessly routed to our WGC Website (which is where all articles, etc. will reside for easy access).

There are a number of very good reasons for this transition: 1) The industry standard is now web-based. Even Whidbey News Times has far more on-line readers than print-copy readers. 2) Sending a PDF, as is currently done, is very problematic due to file sizes, server spam programs, and hyper-link corruption. 3) SEO (search engine optimization) and website evaluation algorithms analyze the number of viewing episodes on our website. That means WGC will gain higher Google scores, ratings, etc. when our readers are routed to the WGC website, which translates into WGC popping up on more searches, which equals more publicity. 4) Ease of editing. Instead of one editor (me), each article or feature can be created individually using a template and added to the Newsletter email.

The downside is that us old-timers, and I proudly resemble that remark, won't have a "newsletter-like" file to read through, or be able to easily print a hard-copy. Please understand that WGC needs to revitalize its business if the club is to survive. If it *can* be done on-line, it *will* be done on-line ... and I myself spend a fair amount of time on Youtube, FB, etc. (if you can't beat 'em, join 'em).

In any case, this is the final Newsletter that I will edit. I will help GM/DOG Dave transition the product onto the web ... hopefully by the New Year. Speaking of which,
