Pastoral Care and Support


At Monkseaton Middle School, each child is a part of a Form Group.

The Form Tutor is the first point of contact for children and families every day. They meet with the children and read every morning. Form Tutors are also responsible for the welfare and care of children in their class and get to know their children very well.



We actively encourage pupils and families to discuss any concerns at an early stage by contacting the Form Tutor in the first instance.

Monkseaton Middle School has two members of staff dedicated to providing pastoral support. Our Assistant Headteacher and our Pastoral Guidance Officer have expertise in family and child welfare and support is available to help families and children throughout the school day.







Academic Success

We want all our children to experience academic success, whatever their starting point.

Our curriculum is broad and ambitious, and offers every child the opportunity to succeed. Our teaching staff are highly trained and continue their study whilst at our school to ensure all children are taught using new and engaging methods of teaching in the best possible way.






New subjects

Children will study English, Maths, Science, Humanities, French, Computing, Art, Music, Technologies, Personal Development, Reading and PE in all year groups.

One of the most exciting features of Monkseaton Middle School is the opportunity children have to study new subjects, using a range of state of the art technologies to develop practical skills. Within Design and Technology lessons, pupils will use pillar drills, disc sanders, strip heaters and vacuum formers. Their ideas and designs are mapped out using Computer Aided Design (CAD) software and then realised through innovative equipment, such as 3D-printers and laser cutters. Children work with a range of resistant materials and hone their joinery, electronics and design skills.

Our dedicated Food Technology room enables children to cook independently and many will use their newly acquired skills as they participate in the 'Future Chef' competition.





At Christmas, we invite residents from a local care home into school to enjoy a 'Vintage Afternoon Tea', where our children have prepared all the food. These cooking skills are further developed within Science, when they participate in campfire cooking.

We have two fully equipped science labs where children will get perhaps their first experience of using Bunsen burners, dissecting pig hearts and exploring the chemicals used in fireworks. Laboratory work also involves dissolving using acids, chromatography and using a condenser for distillation. As well as the classroom-based technologies on offer, we are also very lucky to have rowing machines, which are very popular! Children can chase down personal bests, race over a set distance and even race each other on separate machines.

Children study a wide range of important life skills in Personal Development, including awareness of mental and physical health, relationships, drugs and alcohol and confidence building activities. Children help to develop the curriculum studied and they are very positive about their experiences in lessons.



Extra Curricular Clubs

Our school has a wealth of interesting clubs and activities on offer to your child throughout the year.

A wide variety of PE activities are available including Badminton, Basketball, Athletics, Football, Tennis, Dance, Cycling and Rowing. In addition, we teach children to become 'sports leaders' to work with younger children.

Other popular lunchtime clubs include First Lego League, Ukelele, Choir, Steel pans, Samba, Keyboard, ICT and Animal club.

Our school has a free daily Breakfast Club from 8am and a free after-school Homework Club, three nights per week. All of our clubs are free of charge and all children are welcome.





Enrichment

There are many opportunities that children can take part in throughout the year.

These have included Science activities at Newcastle University, visits to French and Spanish restaurants to practise language skills, local, regional and national sporting competitions, STEM work at Tynemet College participation in the Regional Reading Festival, Coastal fieldwork with Geography, Residential trips to High Borrans outward bound centre and a French Ski trip. Further trips are planned to the French battlefields as part of our history studies.

Children are also encouraged to take part in a range of events linked to their future careers, including a careers 'speed dating' event. Helping even our youngest children to think about their future, can really bring learning to life.

Children with a talent for music, drama and arts can take part in our regular school performances. We have performed a wide range of musicals, including Joseph and Hairspray. We have also performed in musical extravaganza events at the Sage and as part of the Mouth of Tyne festival.

Reading

Our school is heavily focused on reading.

Children are assessed on entry to the school and books are recommended to them to help support their reading skills from the point indicated by the assessment. Each child has a personalised programme to help their reading improve. Children complete regular quizzes and even the most reluctant reader is enthused! Children are listened to reading regularly by Form Tutors, Teachers, Reading Volunteers and even our school dog!

Some children receive additional reading support either with one of our teaching staff or our highly trained learning support staff for reading interventions.

We ask that our families read daily with their child to help improve both their reading skills and vocabulary. This has been shown to have a huge impact on childrens attainment and ability to access their learning.
