As we go forward, projects will continue and the plan will be outlined by the VP of Grounds in regard to start and finish time frames.

Finance's will continue to be one of the Committees main objectives. The Club's Finances are improving however the cost of doing business needs to be kept on track.

As a committee we will endeavour to keep Members well informed of our financial situation.

In closing I would like to point out that the Committee Members of the Rowes Bay Golf Club are all volunteers; they donate their time to help the club. They are members just the same as everyone else and should be treated as such; any complaints or queries are NOT to be taken directly to the Committee Members whilst they are at the club trying to enjoy a drink or their game of golf.

The same rules apply to the staff of the Rowes Bay Golf Club, if the members of the Golf Club have any issues with the staff they are NOT to attack or question the staff directly.

Any problems with the staff should be taken to the Department Manager or the General Manager.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The weather has been sensational of late which has increased our competition numbers as well as our social players, the corporate golf side of the business is in full flight and the numbers have been up on last year so far.

With these positives come some negatives, the course is suffering with increased amounts of divots and plug marks. We will be implementing a hole of the week programme on Saturdays' to help address this issue, I would ask all members to fill one divot other than your own and one extra plug mark to help keep the course in the great condition we have come accustomed to.

On Wednesday 7th of August we are holding a one day Legends Pro-am, I urge all members to get behind and support this event. You will thoroughly enjoy playing with some of the Legends of Australian Golf; I am hoping to have 35 Professionals and roughly 70 Amateur's, it will be a 12 noon shotgun start. If anyone is interested in sponsoring please let me know.

In closing I have attached some figures regarding last year's loss; I am hoping to quash some of the rumours and innuendo doing the rounds at the moment. As staff we hear it all: exorbitant salary packages; too many staff; staff with their fingers in the till etc etc etc.

I personally find this kind of rumour mongering absolutely appalling and disheartening to our hard working staff.

We have a staff of nineteen of that nine are Full Time. Please keep in mind that we work in a service industry that has us open 12 hours a day 364 days of the year.

For those who are genuinely interested in how the business runs, the figures I have provided will help give you an understanding of the challenges we faced last year.

Our current monthly financial update will be on the website as of next week.

The decline in social players can be seen below.

Social 18 hole players are down 722 = \$27,328.82 on last year. Social 9 hole players are down 724 = \$21,849.34 on last year. Social Par 3 players are down 283 = \$11,163.02 on last year. Competition rounds are down 945 = \$13,698.85 on last year

Total loss of revenue <\$74,085.03>

In addition, we have seen a large increase in private golf carts going from 30 to 90.

This increase has cost our club on average 25 cart hires on a Saturday, which represents a loss of \$30,000 dollars a year for just one day of the week.

This is why the landing fee was imposed on the private cart owners. As a business we cannot continue to let our revenue be eroded away.

Please keep in mind a cart hired from RBGC contributes revenue back to the club for the benefit of all members.

GROUNDS UPDATE

What a first 6 months of the year we have had at our club and now is a great opportunity to advise members of all the work our grounds team have been doing both on and off the course.

Rain, rain and more rain, but an event like this provided us a timely opportunity to gather information about how the water impacts the course and where it flows and more importantly, doesn't flow. Over many days we were able to monitor inflows to identify problem areas and deficiencies in the drainage across the back of the course and allow us to formulate some plans to address this ongoing issue and start to implement measures to limit the effect rain has on the course during the wet season. No amount of work will negate the heavy monsoonal rain with falls of 200-300mm and during these times the main course will generally be closed but what we are aiming to achieve is to negate the impacts of showers and storms post the heavy falls that continue to keep the course closed for many weeks. Drainage works have already commenced, and members will see machinery on the course over the next while as we begin this work.

Another issue the big wet has highlighted is the constant battle with salinity we have here at Rowes Bay, this is no more evident than the 4th fairway where large areas of grass have been affected. Jason has commenced work to negate this as an interim step but a complete remediation of the 4th fairway will be required which we expect to undertake this later in the year.

When I took over this role at the start of this year, we produced a business plan and set ourselves some fairly ambitious targets and projects to achieve in the first 6 months of the year. Jason and his team have delivered on every key point in the plan and need to be commended on the work they are doing for the club, and the condition of the golf course.

Much of the work we have been undertaking this year most members would not get to see and whilst it is not as recognisable as the work produced out on the course, it is just as important in the long-term planning of the club. Since the start of this year we have produced a business plan for this financial year, a grounds specific strategic plan to compliment the clubs overall strategic plan and commenced a 3-5-year course master plan. Late last year the club also received a 76-page Environmental Hazard Assessment & Risk Analysis Audit addressing the way we conduct course management and procedures we need to undertake to comply with legislation, we are continuing to work through the reports recommendations to ensure the club meets its obligations.

There has been a tremendous amount of support and goodwill from members in response to helping us achieve our plans and improvements to the course. From donations of machinery and equipment to providing materials to the course and people donating their time to help provide expertise and knowledge to assist the club, it is a representation of the great spirit that runs through the membership of the club.

Jason will advise what has been happening out on the course in his contribution below.

I would also like to remind members that the grounds staff are not to be confronted on the course or directed to undertake tasks that a member may think needs addressing. Unless a member is highlighting a leaking pipe or sprinkler, or damage on the course that requires immediate attention all other enquiries regarding the course should be addressed to myself or the General Manager.

I look forward to updating members every quarter in the newsletter about the improvements to the course and what our plans are, and from time to time will post updates on the website as well.

GROUNDS SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

As Glen has already stated it has been a very big start to the year so far. We have had quite a few projects on top of our normal maintenance and repairs from the floods. We are also at the time of year for most of the major events so we will be trying very hard to present the course as best we can with emphasis going into greens. As the weather turns in our favour the greens will become faster.

The construction of the new 1ST Tee is now complete & the Tee is in play. We have an excavator on loan at the moment with its main purpose to clean out the hazard on 4,5 & 6 but it will be used for various other jobs if time allows.

Aeration of 4 fairway has been done with bulk gypsum applied also. We are trialling some fertiliser to help with the effects of the sodium also to speed recovery up. Similar work is taking place around 3 green with ropes being installed to keep traffic to a minimum until the area has recovered with the addition of a cart path coming shortly.

It is the time of year where we have our best results with weed spraying so we have been busy with this also, with the main issue being crows foot. This does leave discoloured areas & in some cases small bare patches.

The grounds staff would like to thank everyone that has been of assistance & also the members for their patience while works are taking place.

NEWS FROM YOUR CLUB CAPTAIN

1. Completion of score cards.

There are some players in our club who do not fully complete their scorecards in so far as they do not add up their score (be it stroke or stableford) and do not record the score in the spaces allocated on the card. While it is true that the rules of golf do not require a player to do the adding up, common courtesy should ensure that you in fact do so. Please remember that the club committee members who check the cards after each event are volunteers, so if you can make their job just that little bit easier by thoroughly completing your score card, then that would be much appreciated.

Townsville Golf Club have introduced a local rule which stipulates that any player who does not fully complete their score card will be disqualified from that particular competition. Food for thought perhaps??

2. Men's Pennants - 2019.

This year the men's pennants will be held in the Burdekin district on 28 and 29 September. The venues for the Rowes Bay teams are as follows:

A Grade: Home Hill Golf Club B Grade: Ayr Golf Club C Grade: Ayr Golf Club.

The teams for this event will be selected by the Match Committee after the Men's Open Championships which conclude on 18 August 2019. A nomination sheet for interested members will be placed on the clubhouse notice board within the next few weeks.

Also, as a fund raiser to assist the pennants teams, tickets are currently on sale for a framed and signed Queensland State of Origin jersey. Tickets are \$5.00 each and are available at the bar.

3. Hole index information on tee signs.

We are aware that some indexes displayed on our tee signage are no longer correct following a change to the indexes which came into effect earlier this year. Steps are being taken to update the effected signs but in the meantime players are reminded to check their card if they wish to be certain of the hole index for a particular hole.

4. Pace of play signage.

Steps are being taken to have some signs placed on certain tees around the course, with these signs to provide an indication of whether or not you are keeping up with the required pace of play. For example, there will be a sign on the mens number 4 tee with words to the effect of: "you should have teed off 38 minutes ago if you are keeping up with the required pace of play". The purpose of these signs is to provide members with an indicator of whether or not they are on track to complete their round within the expected standard of 4 hours 15 minutes.

5. Temporary changes to the course layout.

Members will have already seen some temporary changes that have been made to the course due to some earthworks that are being undertaken by our grounds staff. Changes being made are as recommended by our very experienced Course Superintendent, Jason Bushell with the support of the Match Committee. As and when these changes are implemented, notices will be posted on the club notice board. Members are asked to abide by these changes noting of course that any changes are only temporary.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT


1. Townsville City Council "Get Active Expo"
